Captain Paul Jung is an officer in the U.S. Public Health Service, currently serving as the Senior Advisor for Healthcare Workforce Development at the Indian Health Service. CAPT Jung's past assignments have included Associate Director of the Peace Corps, Acting Director of the Division of Commissioned Corps Personnel and Readiness within the Office of the Surgeon General, Public Health Investigator for the House Energy and Commerce Committee, Chief of Epidemiology for the Peace Corps, and Chief of Staff for the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. CAPT Jung chaired the Physicians Professional Advisory Committee of the U.S. Public Health Service for two terms. He graduated from the University of Maryland School of Medicine and completed residencies in internal medicine at Case Western Reserve University (MetroHealth) and preventive medicine at Emory University.
