Documentation:

Specific documentation requirements and education are required by LAW for Colorado chiropractors - this seminar will review these requirements. This interactive seminar will include an overview of documentation, the initial patient consultation, daily treatment notes, and patient re-evaluation. This course will cover all aspects of clinical documentation for the chiropractic office, including implementation of the Colorado Board of Chiropractic Examiners's Rule 22. Review the documentation requirements for patient consultation and history, physical exam findings, tests, and measurements, subjective complaints, functional goals, diagnosis, and treatment plans. Also sharpen your general knowledge of the Board of Chiropractic Examiners Rules and Regulations.
