## Speaker Biographies

**Josiah Alamu** - Dr. Josiah Alamu, Ph.D., M.P.H., Associate Professor and Chair, Public Health Department joined the University of Illinois Springfield in fall 2008. He received his MPH (Epidemiology concentration) from the University of Hawaii Honolulu and his PhD (Epidemiology and minor in Biostatistics) from the University of Iowa. Dr. Alamu teaches several courses at both graduate and undergraduate level, including: Foundations of Epidemiology, Biostatistics for the Health Professional, Analytical Epidemiology, Chronic/Infectious Disease Epidemiology, Global Environmental Health, and undergraduate ECCE course in Epidemiology.

**Deborah H. Allen** - Dr. Allen has 35 years of nursing experience, has worked at Duke since 1982, and has worked with oncology patients throughout her career. She became involved in the NC Advisory Committee for Cancer Control and Coordination as a representative for the NC Nurses Association in 2008. It is through this work that she was introduced to the NC Radon Program Director, Phillip Gibson, and the effects of radon. By working together they are educating health care professionals regarding radon which she will discuss today.

**Allison Bain** - Allie is a Program Coordinator for the Iowa Cancer Consortium. Within her role she works to bring over 400 individuals and organizational members together from the public health, nonprofit, and healthcare communities to collaborate to reduce the burden of cancer in Iowa. Allie focuses on cancer prevention and has worked closely with local, state, and national organizations to plan, implement and evaluate programs on a variety of topics including radon education, testing and mitigation across the state. Allie also facilitates the Iowa Radon Coalition. Allie has a Bachelor's degree in Biology and a Master's degree in Public Health.

**Denise S. Bleiler** - Denise is the Radiation Protection Program Supervisor of the Radon Monitoring Section within the Bureau of Radiation Protection. Denise joined the Radon Division as a Radiation Health Physicist June 2011 and has been the Program Supervisor since January 2012. Prior to beginning employment with the Bureau of Radiation Protection she has worked full time as a Nuclear Medicine Technologist since 1985. Her B.S. degree is in Biology from Millersville University 1985. She continues to hold Certifications in Nuclear Medicine Technology and also Nuclear Cardiology Technology.

**Nancy Bredhoff** - Nancy has served as President of Radon Testing Corporation of America, Inc. (RTCA) from 1989 to present. Nancy currently is the President of the National Radon Safety Board (NRSB).

**Tony Colgan** - Tony is a health physicist who is head of the Radiation Protection Unit at the International Atomic Energy Agency. Before joining the IAEA in 2009, he was deputy director of Ireland's Radiation Protection Institute. At IAEA, Tony is responsible for providing oversight for the development and implementation of radiation protection standards, including those relating to public exposure due to radon.

**Claudia Crist** - Claudia Crist, RN has been the chief deputy director of policy and programs for the California Department of Public Health since June 22, 2015. Prior to that, Crist was deputy director of health care delivery systems at the California Department of Health Care Services since January 2015. She held several positions at Sutter Health from 2000 to 2014, including assistant administrator, revenue cycle process leader, regional director of training and development, system director of clinical auditing, manager of clinical auditing and senior internal auditor. Ms. Crist is a member of the American College of Healthcare Executives and the California Association of Healthcare Leaders. **Clark Eldredge** - Clark was the first hire into the Florida Radon Program in 1988. On his first day of work, he flew from Tallahassee, FL, to Louisville, KY, to take the EPA Reducing Radon in Structures Course. Since that time he has been involved with the certification of radon professionals, investigated and responded to unique and developing radon issues, consulted on difficult radon problems, provided training to industry and state personnel, participated in the development of radon measurement, mitigation and resistant construction protocols, codes, standards and guidance at the state and federal level. As of September 2nd, he became the Florida Radon Program Administrator Emeritus and now administers the Florida X-Ray Machine Registration Program.

These works include serving on Technical and Science Committees, Technical and Policy advisory boards and currently as Chair of Executive Stakeholder Committee for the AARST Consortium on National Radon Standards (accredited by ANSI).

**Phillip H. Jenkins** - Dr. Jenkins is a Certified Health Physicist with forty years' experience with radon. Phil has served on the AARST board for several years and will become President during the symposium in San Diego. Among the many AARST initiatives, he looks forward to continued efforts related to standards, training and radon measurement inter-comparisons both nationally and internationally.

**Marc Katz** - Marc grew up in New Jersey where he was lucky enough to enjoy the Jersey shore and Jersey pizza. He went to school at Rutgers School of Public Health for epidemiology and health education. **Joshua Kerber** - Joshua is an Environmental Research Scientist for the Minnesota Department of Health. He has worked in the indoor air quality and radon field since 2002 and the home construction industry prior to that time. He has a Master's Degree in Atmospheric Science and has worked and trained in two state radon programs: Minnesota and Ohio. More recently Joshua has worked on the implementation of the Minnesota Radon Awareness Act and the Minnesota Radon Licensing Act. He assists Minnesota contractors with radon and vapor intrusion mitigation assistance, along with providing research, information, and outreach to Minnesota and national constituents. He serves on many national radon standard workgroups including the Conference of Radiation Control Program Director's E-25 committee on radon.

**Melinda Lewis** - Melinda has worked for the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Radon Program since January of 2012. Prior to her full time position at IEMA, Melinda completed an internship with the Radon Program during her graduate work at University of Illinois- Springfield. She also spent two and a half years working for the Environmental Programs section of the American Lung Association in Illinois.

**John Mallon** - John Mallon is Partner at Radon Detection and Control in Pittsburgh. RDC has installed over 27,000 Mitigation Systems. **Jessica Maloney** - Ms. Maloney has a Bachelor of Science in Environmental and Public Health from the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire. She has enjoyed working for the state of Wisconsin for over 16 years. She currently serves as the state Indoor Air and Radon Program Manager at the Wisconsin Department of Health Services. She is also a very busy mother of two awesome girls who make her want to be a better person every day.

**Mark Needham** - Environmental Compliance Program Supervisor, Ohio Department of Health.

**David Pawel** - Dr. David J. Pawel, a member of the (U.S.) National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, is an expert on assessing health risks from environmental exposures to radiation. At EPA, his responsibilities include the evaluation of radio-epidemiological literature and implementation of Agency's radiogenic risk models. Dr. Pawel is an author of journal articles and technical reports on EPA radiation risk models and projections for the U.S. population, such as "EPA Assessment of Risk from Radon in Homes" (2003) which describes the scientific basis and underlying methodology for current EPA estimates of risks from radon. More recently, Dr. Pawel co-authored the technical report referred to as the "Blue Book", which describes the radiation risk models that will be applied to update EPA's cancer risk coefficients for environmental exposure to radionuclides. Prior experience includes evaluation of radiation risks to the atomic bomb survivors as a research scientist at the Radiation Effects Research Foundation (RERF) in Japan from 1992-1994. In 2003, Dr. Pawel was awarded a Gilbert W. Beebe Fellowship, which enabled him to revisit RERF to study methods to improve cancer-specific radiogenic risk estimates. He is a recipient of EPA's Science Achievement Award for his work on risk assessment methodology. Dr. Pawel has also served as a member of the U.S. delegation to the United Nations Scientific Committee on Effects from Atomic Radiation (UNSCEAR).

**Lane Mathis Price** - Dr. Lane Price, M.D. is a retired radiation oncologist from Decatur, Alabama. In 2003, Dr. Price became active with U.S. radon education and policy after recognizing the significant lack of radon knowledge while treating patients. She spoke eloquently on the subject of patient-family radon education at the 2003 International Radon Symposium and worked with Washington policy makers on improving radon policies.

**Shawn Price** - Shawn has 27 years of radon experience with specialties in radon measurement technologies, certification, protocol development/interpretation, laboratory operations, and quality assurance. Shawn is currently the Market Development Manager for Spruce Environmental Technologies after managing the daily operations of a NELAP-accredited laboratory. Shawn is the outgoing AARST President, chairs two AARST standard committees, and serves on the NRPP Policy Advisory Board.

**Melinda Ronca-Battista** - Melinda is privileged to work for the Tribal Air Monitoring Support Center, where she provides software tools and online and workshop trainings for Tribal environmental monitoring programs across the US. Following college, she has worked for about 30 years in the environmental monitoring and radiation protection fields. She held positions with USEPA in Washington D.C and as a private contractor, where she conducted audits of radiation handling programs at military sites, laboratories, radiopharmaceutical manufacturers, and nuclear power plants. She worked with a crack team of experts to co-chair the ANSI standard on radon measurement performance criteria issued in 2015, and is chairing the committee to develop quality assurance criteria for radon measurement systems. Years ago, Melinda began working with tribes after conducting surveys of radioactive materials on Navajo Nation land. Now she works for Tribes during the day, and on nights and weekends engages in her passion for making statistics, QC, and data management as meaningful and interesting as she can make it.

**David Rowson** - Dave is the Director of Office of Radiation and Indoor Air (ORIA). ORIA's mission is to protect the public and the environment from the risks of radiation and indoor air pollution. ORIA develops criteria, standards, guidance, policies, and programs to limit unnecessary radiation exposure and control exposure to indoor air pollutants.

**Yigang Sun** - Dr. Yigang Sun received his Ph.D. in Agricultural and Biological Engineering from University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2007. From 2006 to 2015, he worked as a senior research engineer in the Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering at UIUC with a focus on indoor air ventilation and air quality, and bio-energy technology. In late 2015, he joined the Indoor Climate Research and Training program at UIUC as a research engineer. His current research interests include residential buildings' indoor air quality, ventilation, heating and cooling, energy efficiency, and comfort of indoor climate.

The Leech Lake Air Program has established a number of partnerships with the local communities, schools, and organizations to promote air awareness and improve air quality for the Leech Lake Reservation and surrounding communities. Brandy joined the E-25 Committee as an Advisor specifically for Indian Country in 2015 and has served on the AARST Foundation Board since 2014. In 2012 she was awarded the esteemed Virgil Masayesva Excellence Award recognizing her contributions to the protection of air quality, health and the environment throughout Indian Country.
