Charges:

1. Review existing NRC, EPA, DOE and CRCPD Suggested State Regulations for Control of Radioactive Materials.
2. Review existing CRCPD and industrial (e.g., ISRI) Guidance for response to discovered orphan sources.
3. Review DOT, NRC, EPA, DHS, IAEA and other protocols for response to orphan sources and radioactive commodities.
4. Determine essential radiological controls needed to protect the public, workers and environment during the immediate response to orphan sources and radioactive commodities discovered in commerce and/or at the entry to U.S. borders.
5. Determine appropriate domestic and international notifications and timelines for such discoveries.
6. To ensure environmental protection and public health and safety, develop a protocol for use by the federal government and states when responding to orphan sources and radioactive commodities discovered in commerce and/or at the entry to U.S. borders.
