

About the Information Age Learning Center

The Information Age Learning Center incorporated in 1999 as a 501(c)(3) educational non-profit organization located at the historic site of the American Marconi Belmar Wireless Station, which ultimately became the U.S. Army Camp Evans Signal Laboratory. The **AOC Garden State Chapter** has been a corporate sponsor from its beginning. InfoAge has evolved into a consortium of science and history museums and exhibits which serve as the focal point for the preservation and interpretation of New Jersey's rich communications, computer, and electronic technology and history. It is a place where children and families are educated in the technologies we use today, many of which were developed at Camp Evans. The MISSION of the Information Age Science and History Museum and Learning Center (InfoAge) is to preserve, educate, and honor scientific innovation to inspire new generations of thinkers, dreamers, and visionaries.

This historic campus opened in the early 1900s as a Marconi wireless telegraph station, in Wall Township, NJ; served as a Navy/RCA communications laboratory during World War I, and was known as the Camp Evans Signal Corps Research and Development laboratory from World War II until 1997. These events and others earned designations by the U.S. Department of the Interior on the National Register of Historic Places and prestigious status as a National Historic Landmark. InfoAge also became a Save America's Treasures site Bill Clinton administration and Preserve America Steward during the George W. Bush administration. InfoAge is also the World War II Living Memorial for the State of New Jersey.

The **AOC Garden State Chapter** is in the process of expanding the InfoAge Electronic Warfare Display into the Intelligence and EW Pavilion. In addition, AOC GSC has a campaign underway to transport, refurbish and permanently display a Guardrail RC-12 SIGINT aircraft that is currently at the Joint Base McGuire, Dix, Lakehurst NAS NJ.
