She has also served as a guest accreditor for ASHP.

Dr. Schwartzman practices at the WesternU Patient Care Center and at an FQHC in an ambulatory care setting where she works with an interprofessional team to manage chronic diseases in patients, with a focus in diabetes. Dr. Schwartzman has a research and teaching focus in communication skills and diabetes. She is a Certified Diabetes Educator through the National Certification Board for Diabetes Educators, a Board Certified Ambulatory Care Pharmacist, and an Advanced Practice Pharmacist.

Dr. Schwartzman was the recipient of the ASHP Foundation 2017 Residency Preceptor of the Year Award, and has been recognized by WesternU for a Faculty Service Award and Preceptor Award.
