Folks who have attended, or presented, at prior CSTA conferences are considered good candidates for reviewers, as are those who are proposing sessions at CSTA. Please note that prior attendance, attendance this year, or proposing a presentation this year are not requirements for reviewers. If you are interested in, and have a connection to K12 computer science, please consider helping us out.

Submissions are limited to about 2 1/2 pages of information so each review will likely take no more than 15-30 minutes. Reviewers will have an opportunity to indicate a preference to not review any assigned submission. We might ask you to help out with additional reviews near the end to make up for people who were unable to complete their assignments. We hope to have at least 3-4 reviewers per submission- many reviewers means less work for each.

We hope to complete the reviews during the first two weeks of December.
