Navigating Today's Hospice Survey Landscape: The Intersection Between Compliance and Regulatory Requirements

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has implemented increased scrutiny of hospice programs related to growing concerns over hospice service fraud as well as concerns regarding the integrity of hospice service provided. Hospice leaders must understand this new CMS survey landscape and the importance of key survey readiness to avoid enforcement remedies and ensure regulatory compliance. CHAP will provide an overview of CMS oversight priorities and survey/regulatory landscape and top survey findings; Strategies for implementation of an effective survey readiness program will be discussed.
