ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER : ORDER LIMITING COURT HOURS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

On March 9, 2020, Ohio Governor DeWine issued Executive Order 2020-01D declaring a state of emergency in Ohio in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19);

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a global “pandemic” requiring “urgent and aggressive action” to control the spread of COVID-19;

On March 13, 2020, President Trump declared a National Emergency;

On March 27, 2020, Governor DeWine signed into law Am.Sub.H.B. No. 197, immediately tolling, retroactive to March 9, 2020, all statutes of limitation, time limitations, and deadlines in the Ohio Revised Code and the Ohio Administrative Code until the expiration of Executive Order 2020-01D or July 30, 2020, whichever is sooner;

On March 27, 2020, Ohio Supreme Court Chief Justice O’Connor issued an ORDER, tolling all time requirements contained in Court rules promulgated by the Ohio Supreme Court and the Montgomery County Probate Court, retroactive to March 9, 2020 and expiring on the date the emergency ends or July 30, 2020, whichever is sooner;

THEREFORE, the Montgomery County Probate Court **ORDERS** the following changes:

The Court will remain open for e-filing. However, from Monday, April 12- Friday May 1, 2020, the Court will be open from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday – Thursday and closed on Fridays.
