



David Wick, Ed.D.

Dr. David Wick worked to increase access for minoritized students, to foster inclusion, and expand equity in education abroad and other international education activities for over 20 years at four U.S. universities. Now, as an Assistant Professor at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey,

Wick's teaching focuses on student learning through international education, equity, and inclusion. Wick currently teaches courses on equity and social justice in international education, holistic student development, learning and technology, and comparative international education in the francophone world. Wick also serves as Faculty Director of Fellowships and conducts outreach, advising, support and campus panels related to Boren, CLS, Davis Projects for Peace, Fulbright, and other fellowships and grants. Wick's teaching, research, and scholarship focuses on designing and delivering education, and international education, to foster equity and social justice for students, their communities, and the world at large. As part of this Wick co-edited the January 2020 special issue of *Frontiers* on diversity, equity, and inclusion. He also co-authored a chapter "Examining International Education's Potential for Advancing Social Justice" for a forthcoming NAFSA volume on international education and social justice.

Wick has worked with Diversity Abroad since it was founded. He has contributed as an author, online training creator, session and workshop presenter, and special program designer. He has attended and presented at every Diversity Abroad conference. He is particularly proud of three of his DA projects; his leadership on the design of an online pre-departure training program on identities abroad that students from all DA member institutions could access, his work to develop and lead DA Future Leader Summits on Curriculum, Culture, and Cost; and his co-facilitation of leadership workshops at the first five DA conferences.

Wick has given over 100 sessions and workshops at professional and academic conferences on topics related to international education, equity, diversity, and inclusion. His current professional leadership activities include service as past-president of Macalester College's Alumni Board, TLS (teaching, learning and scholarship) representative to NAFSA Region XII, peer reviewer for the Forum on Education Abroad's Quality Improvement Program, and advisor for the Institute for Study Abroad's Inclusive Excellence Advisory group.
