- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) hosted a conference call on Thursday, March 19, to discuss the current status of the COVID-19 (coronavirus) outbreak and its effect on Cargo and Port Operations.
 - **New restrictions on travelers do not pertain to cargo**
 - This applies to the recent agreement made between the Canadian and U.S. government to close the Northern Border to non-essential travel. Cargo is considered essential and therefore should not be subjected to additional screenings or potential slowdowns.
 - Just as the Northern Border has been closed to non-essential travel, a formal essential-only announcement should be coming soon for the Southern Border. Just like the Northern Border closing, there will be no restrictions on cargo or expected personnel reductions.
- There have been no operational changes at Ports of Entry. CBP has encountered an uptick of personnel testing positive for COVID-19 and is now up to about 30 Officers who are in quarantine protocol. If a reduction of staff at ports becomes significant, ports have their own contingency plans.

US Ports – West Coast

- Effective March 24 there will be new gate hours for the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach. The changes, approved on March 22, 2020 by industry marine terminal operators will allow for thorough equipment cleaning protocols and procedures during the COVID-19 health crisis in an effort to protect worker health.
 - The second labor shift will begin at 7:00 p.m. and end at 4 a.m. Pacific Time to allow for cleaning and spraying of equipment. The first shift will remain with a start time of 8:00 a.m. Pacific time.

 - Several procedures in effect to lessen risk of exposure
 - Closed common areas, operators reporting directly to specific cranes, increasing distance between employees, etc
