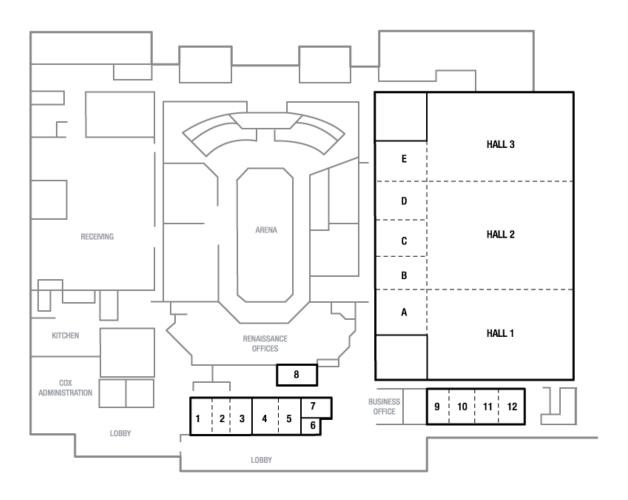

Social Equity by Design: Designing Connections Through Community

Social equality is a multifaceted concept that deals with the idea of "biological equality" of all human beings regardless of race or gender, and supports the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights. "Social equity includes universal fulfillment of the most fundamental human needs along with broad access to meaningful work, while respecting the enormous range of life circumstances and personal goals which may drive people to seek different kinds of livelihood."

How can designers work to ensure social equity? Keynote Speaker Vernice Miller-Travis shares her experience with us, and helps us understand how our focus on equity translates into specific policies and planning actions that can promote -social, environmental, economic, spiritual, cultural, and physical equity in our communities.

Vernice Miller-Travis is nationally recognized as a Senior Facilitator in:

- Multi-stakeholder design and planning;
- Environmental justice;
- Brownfield redevelopment;
- Equitable development;
- Community revitalization;
- Collaborative problem solving at all scales.

She has also successfully facilitated meaningful and productive dialogues among federal agencies, state, tribal and local governments, industry and communities challenged with environmental justice concerns and burdened by historical divisions. Miller-Travis's active leadership is best illustrated by her efforts to institute community advisory groups and facilitating public engagement in the Chavis Community Conversation, Freeport Forward, the Northern Birmingham Community Coalition and the Leadership in Environmental Action Pilots for the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control.

Miller-Travis is also an educator, having led numerous training efforts on Collaborative Problem Solving, Building Cultural Competence, Social Equity, and Environmental Justice for government agencies and local community members. From 2010 to 2017, she has lead a coalition of civil rights and environmental justice advocates with the goal to develop a Civil Rights Enforcement toolkit, and reorganize the Office of Civil Rights at the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

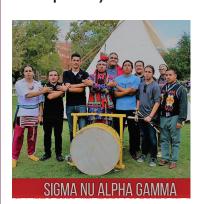
