The Preceptorial in Endocrine Aspects of Neoplasia, Metabolism and Diabetes, sponsored by the Endocrine Fellows Foundation, is conducted at the NIH Clinical Center in Bethesda, Maryland. The NIH Clinical Center is the world's largest clinical research complex housing some of the most extensive and highly regarded research facilities, including a 242 bed hospital dedicated to outstanding patient care. The faculty for this preceptorship includes world-renown leaders with expertise in basic and clinical research involving lipodystrophy, insulin resistance, Cushing's syndrome, adrenal insufficiency, Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1, pseudohypoparathyroidism, hypophosphatemia, pheochromocytoma, thyroid disease and obesity. Trainees benefit by seeing patients with these disorders first-hand and interact with investigators investigating the pathophysiology and genetic basis of disease as well as diagnostic strategies and treatment. Six fellows from across the country will attend this two week NIH Preceptorship opportunity.

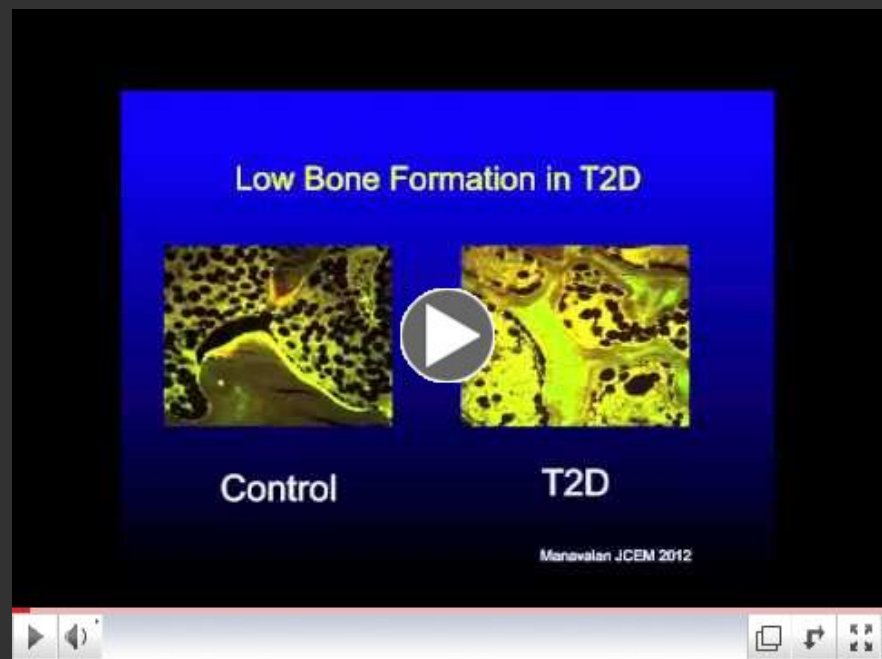
