

Expert Seminars

The Pre-Conference has long been a part of the FALI Conference. This is an extra "full" day of training, prior to the official start of the Conference. The speaker can cover a lot more material then the typical Conference session. Up until 5 years ago, the Pre-Conference was an add on, for an extra fee, sometimes equal to the regular Conference fee, depending on the speaker.

With a goal of giving back to the membership in the form of benefits, the FALI Board decided to start offering the Pre-Conference, FREE of charge to fully paid Conference attendees. The Board is able to do this by negotiating special, flat fee rates with the speakers, that FALI covers. The response has been so fantastic, that this annual event has truly become 3 full days for many attendees.



This year's Pre-Conference was a full day with Cynthia Hetherington. With over two decades of expertise, the Hetherington Group is a leader in investigative due diligence, corporate intelligence, and cyber investigations. They train thousands of investigators in the public and private sectors annually; and share their expertise in this increasingly data-intensive, cyber focused-world. In 2015, they founded the OSMOSIS Institute, host of the annual OSMOSIS Conference. Hundreds of investigators across the nation attend to gain insights into Open Source Intelligence and receive training from the most recognized social media and open source trainers in North America. This year, Osmosis will be in Orlando, and FALI members may attend for a discount using the code in the ad on the previous page.

As stated above, Cynthia's presentation consisted of three of her most popular training modules. During the morning session, "Advanced Social Media Investigations," participants reviewed social media pages, learned how hashtags and images can play a role in a case, and identifing further leads. In addition, they learned how to conduct a CARA Analysis: Characteristics, Associations, Reputation, and Affiliations.

The after lunch session consisted of two parts. First up was "Conducting Online Asset Investigations." During this session attendees learned a lot including the six reasons of when, where, and why to conduct an asset investigation, and what resources, both online and offline, are most beneficial for locating leads or content. The last session of the day, "Understanding the Dark Web," took participants on a trip through the channels used to institute private sales and exchanges, and criminal behavior. Participants gained an understanding of the Dark Web: criminality, anonymity, counterfeit products, child pornography, and human trafficking; learned the directory structures of the Dark Web; and Dark Web languages like "Tor and Tails" and the lingo of this underworld.

After a full day of learning, Conference attendees got just a little more when Cynthia officially opened the Conference on Friday morning with a 90 minute presentation on "Social Network Monitoring."

Cynthia is a big believer in sharing her information. She shared several components of her presentation with FALI. These can be accessed by "members only" who after logging in to their FALI account, can look under the "Resources" tab on the left hand side of the home page.

Conference Highlights Friday, May 3, 2019

The dynamics of putting together a successful Conference can be very challenging. You have to decide the best speakers and topics, breakout sessions vs. general sessions, opportunities for attendees to network with one another, as well as the vendors who support the Conference financially, and don't forget FUN!

The Conference Committee approached the speaker line-up differently this year. While everyone knows there is a lot of knowledge, and expertise, within the FALI membership, the launch of the FBCI program proved it in writing as members submitted their credentials for review. This in turn sparked the idea of the RFP process for speakers for the 2019 Conference. Twenty-five were submitted, with the majority coming from within the membership. It was a hard decision but the committee ended up with a line-up of 16 excellent speakers presenting on a variety of different topics that were well received by Conference attendees. If you are interested in speaking at the 2020 Conference, by on the lookout for the RFP soon.

The "official" start to the Conference was Friday morning with another offering from **Cynthia Hetherington**, **Social Network Monitoring**.



This was followed by a presentation by Jan Edwards, founder of Paving the Way Foundation: What PIs Need to Know About Human **Trafficking** (HT). Paving the Wav Foundation which works to educate children, teens, and parents on the epidemic that is sweeping our State.

Many FALI members have committed to being involved in HT investigations, pro-bono, and FALI as an organization is getting more involved with Florida based Anti HT non-profits to help expand the reach of our members. In fact, when the FALI officers were in Tallahassee in March in addition to speaking about our profession's issues, they spoke to legislators about our involvement in HT issues. Some were surprised to hear about this connection, but all were very open, and appreciative of this personal commitment.

Speaking of Tallahassee, our lunch key note speaker was the new **Director of the Division of Licensing, Steve Hurm**, who shared his plans for the Division and most importantly, asked how he, and his team could work effectively with FALI and its members. Both during his presentation, and then afterwards, for quite awhile in the hallway, he took questions from members and wrote lots of notes, on the issues that were mentioned.





The first after lunch session was led by **Brad Dalhover** who shared information about *Case Management Software for PIs.* After Brad was the first concurrent breakout session of the Conference which consisted of



three choices: Johnson Blakely: Surveillance Cases Step-by-Step, past FALI President Mark Murnan: Defending Agains Claims of Sexual Abuse, and Bruce Anderson: Investigating BEC Compromise Scams. Each of the breakout rooms was full with lots of notes being taken electronically or by the old fashioned paper and pen method.

The last "official" business for the day was the **FALI Annual Business** meeting which was called to order by FALI President, **Rick Root**. One of the first orders of business was the certification of the election by Election Chairman, **Jack Belich**. This is the third year we have conducted our election online and it has been a success. Some of the issues discussed during the meeting included how DoL is working with DoR to get them a list of all the A agencies in the State so DoR can FINALLY get a realistic look at how little PIs pay in sales tax and why they should be exempt. FALI's involvement in helping DoL update the PI Handbook was also discussed. Legislative Chair, Mark Lynn asked for members to contact him with suggestions.
