

Hands on training and practice is essential to honing your skills to become better at surveillance. Once you are comfortable with these skills it's crucial that you understand the other side of the coin. That's why learning about Surveillance Detection Route (SDR) is essential to becoming a better surveillance operator. SDR is a counter-surveillance technique that helps detect, thwart, or manipulate a surveillance team. #### **Legislation Chaos and Election Year Madness**

#### Lisa Turley, Legislative Advisory Board Chair

The current political environment in Washington, D.C. has seemingly been hostile for a period of time. It also may seem easier to be apathetic or uncommitted when thinking about engagement and/or legislative advocacy. However, I'd be remi

ss not to thank all the professional volunteers who recently came to Washington, D.C. for the return of NCISS Hit-The-Hill (HTH) event when we did just that-advocated for YOU!

There was a sense of purpose and focus as we walked the halls in the Senate and Representative buildings to meet and educate our respective legislators and/or legislative staff about our profession and how investigators are incredibly relevant and intricate in the legal community. We as professionals come from different parts of the country, have varied opinions, but collectively and with a unified voice represented you and our profession as we diffused myths and mis concepts of Private Investigators as a whole. Another integral part were our incredible HTH sponsors who contributed so many could join us in that support of our profession. The power of cohesiveness warms the heart. If you haven't been to Hit-The-Hill before, we encourage you to make plans now to attend in 2025. It is a life-changing experience.

As mentioned in the legislative advocacy, data privacy continues to be a hot topic with the surrounding subset of protecting children; collection of data on social media platforms; the use of data information; artificial intelligence and the impacts of algorithms influence of data access and safeguards, etc.

With the recent Department of Labor (DOL) Final Rule now in effect, increased concern about Independent Contractor (IC) status has led NCISS to take several approaches to communicate our concerns to include: 1) a letter campaign to Chairs and Ranking Members of key committees both in the Senate and the House; 2) NCISS also joined coalition under S.J. 63 and H.J. 116 with other organizations to nullify the DOL "new rule" setting enforcement standard DOL will use for determining whether a worker is an employee or independent contractor under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA); 3) spoke directly with legislators at HTH. NCISS members utilize ICs around the country for litigation support and understand the importance of ICs. NCISS will continue to monitor legislative concerns. #### NCISS Board Approves Support of Coalition Opposing DOL Rule

#### Congressional Review Act -- joint resolutions in the Senate and House --H.J. Res 116 and S.J. Res 63

Joint resolutions were introduced in both the Senate and House, to nullify the U.S. Department of Labor's ("DOL") recently finalized regulation (the "new rule")1 that sets the enforcement standard DOL will use for determining whether a worker is an employee or an independent contractor under the Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA").

In early March, the NCISS Legislative Committee proposed to the Board to join this coalition in support of the joint resolutions opposing the DOL Rule. In mid March, the NCISS Board unanimously passed in support of the joint resolutions.

#### Legislative fix to DOL rule

Many industry groups, including NCISS, are hoping for a legislative fix to this terrible rule. Several legislators have signaled that they will file legislation to quash the rule, or to amend it.

The NCISS Legislation team drafted a letter to the Senate and House Labor Committee Chairs and Ranking Members, which was sent to them in mid-January. (a copy of the letter is attached). Among other things, our letter urged the Committee members to carefully consider the potential consequences of the ruling. We requested that they work with us to find a solution which balances the protection of worker rights with the unique needs of the private investigator and security professions. NCISS continues to seek a legislative solution to this issue.

#### Here is a sampling of some of FALI's legislative accomplishments over the years:

- 2023: Elimination of the Sales Tax on private investigative services after 30+ years. Click <u>HERE</u> for FAQ,
- 2023: Increase in JAC rate from \$40 to \$50 per hour.
- Elimination of physical addresses of Class A PI Agency licensees from the Division of Licensing (DOL) website. This request must be made in writing to the DOL. Click <u>HERE</u> for details.
- Expansion of calibers to include .40 S&W and .45ACP for Class G Licensees.
- Proposed and passed <u>"Increased Penalties for Unlicensed Activities"</u>.
- Proposed and passed the window tint restriction for PIs and agency owned vehicles. Click <u>HERE</u> to access the Statute. If you have tinted your windows to this standard it is recommended, you keep a copy in your glove box should you be stopped.
- Defeated bills that would have restricted access to Social Security Numbers to Licensed Florida Private Investigators.
- Assisted Department of Revenue in crafting a refund procedure for insurance companies requesting sales-tax refunds that made sense for private investigators.
- Worked on extension of the length of time for the renewal of the Class A license from 2 years to 3 years.
- Defeated the attempts to move our licensing from the DOL to the Department of Business and Professional Regulations (DBPR). Under DOL there are three professions regulated under 493. Under the DBPR we would have been lost, and possibly minimized, among the 34 + services and industries.
- Defeated bills to reduce fees that would be charged to do abandoned property work in Florida
- Assisted in working out a reciprocal agreement with other states for licensed Florida Private Investigators to work on a temporary basis.
- Worked with DOL on budget reductions that proposed the closing of 6 DOL Offices statewide.
- Assisted in repealing the DOL insurance requirement for private investigators of non-essential coverage.
- Work with other PI associations throughout the country to show support for their position regarding legislation they are facing in their State, and they work with us when we are facing legislation that impacts the profession.

## FALI consistently monitors bills designed to limit public records access for Private Investigators.

FALI is an active participant in the DOL's Private Investigation, Recovery, and Security Advisory Council (PIRSAC) which meets at least four times a year to advise FDACS and make recommendations relative to the regulation of the 493 professions. Over the years we have been involved in many important decisions by the Council to further protect the profession, and our interests. Click <u>HERE</u> for more details.

If you are not presently holding an elective office and if you desire to offer yourself for election, or if you desire to nominate someone to stand for election, then your statement of candidacy or nomination must be sent to me, via email, U.S. Mail, or fax, **no** earlier than Thursday April 4th and **no** later than 5pm on Saturday April 13, 2024. All candidates for office must meet the requirements as provided for in the FALI Constitution and Bylaws.

We will once again be conducting the FALI election online. We have engaged a professional, third-party company, whose only business is conducting on-line elections, to host our electronic voting. Full details and voter instructions will be forthcoming soon.

Note: All positions are open for nomination. Only the president has an exclusion on who can run.

#### According to FALI Bylaws\* :

4.1 **Qualifications**. All nominees, and Board members must be an Active member in good standing for the last 12 months immediately preceding that election. If there is not a candidate meeting the qualifications, then the position can be filled by a majority vote of the Board, after the election. A nominee or Board member may not be a member of any other professional investigative association whose primary office is located in Florida, and must have internet capabilities. Nominees for President shall have served on the Board of Directors for one (1) year within the prior three (3) years.

#### 4.2 Nominations

All candidates shall be nominated by Active members in good standing. The nomination period shall be for ten days. The dates for beginning and closing of nominations, which shall be publicized via email, the FALI Forum, and the FALI Listserv, shall begin at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the FALI Annual Educational Conference. Nominations will be closed twenty (20) days prior to the first day of the FALI Annual Educational Conference, in order to provide ten (10) days for actual voting. Nominations will not be accepted from the floor of the general membership meeting.

#### According to FALI Constitution\*:

**ARTICLE V. ELECTED OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS** The Board of Directors shall consist of the elected officers (president, vice president, secretary and treasurer) who shall not serve more than three (3) consecutive terms, and one area director representing each of the regions in the State of Florida who shall be elected by ballot (including absentee ballots received prior to elections) for a one (1) year term or until their successors are elected. Should the president's position go unfilled at the end of three (3) consecutive terms, the Board of Directors may authorize, by majority vote, the termed-out president to fill the vacancy by election for one additional year but cannot exceed two years.
