Brad Briscoe enlisted in the United States Naval Reserve on February 26, 1985. Attaining the rank of Hospitalman Second Class, he served nearly 5 ½ years from 1985-1991. During the same period, as part of the Naval Reserve Sea and Air Mariner Program, he also successfully completed his Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from the University of Louisville, Louisville, Kentucky in May 1991. Subsequently, he was commissioned as Ensign in the Navy Nurse Corps. His duty assignments include: Naval Hospital Orlando, Florida from 1991-1995: where he served as emergency staff nurse and relief charge nurse.

Naval Hospital Naples Italy from 1995-1997. Served as the first Director of Health Promotion. He led the development of a fledgling health promotion program for the Naples Naval Hospital and all of its tenant commands to include La Madellena, Gaeta, and Cappaduchinno, Italy, as well as Souda Bay, Crete. Additionally he actively participated in several Tricare Europe Health Promotion conferences and initiatives.

Naval Regional Medical Center, San Diego, CA from 1997-2000 - where he worked as charge nurse in a high-volume, high acute emergency department and teaching facility that average 152 -200 daily patient visits from 1997 through 2000. While in San Diego, Mr. Briscoe was selected for full-time duty under instruction and pursued his Masters of Science in Nursing as Emergency/Trauma Clinical Nurse Specialist and Adult Acute Care Nurse Practitioner at the University of Kentucky during the period of 2000-2002.

Naval Hospital Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, where he worked as clinical nurse specialist, nurse practitioner, and division officer in the emergency department and Convenient Care Clinic from 2002-2005.

From 2005-2008 he served in similar capacities in the emergency department, as well as Head, Wellness Center/Health Promotion Program, at Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Florida.

Naval Hospital Beaufort, South Carolina he worked as Medical Officer for Permanent Party Sick Call, Acute Care Area, Recruit Sick Call and Weapons Battalion Aid Station on Parris Island from 2008-2011.

Mr. Briscoe joined the UF Health Team in July 2011 and recently attained his Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from the University of Kentucky in December 2013.

Mr. Briscoe's personal military awards and decorations include the Joint Service Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (with 3 Gold Stars), Joint Service Achievement Medal, Navy Achievement Medal Joint Service Meritorious Unit Award, Meritorious Unit Commendation (with Bronze Star), Naval Reserve Meritorious Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal (with Bronze Star), Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, Over Seas Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, and Navy Expert Rifleman Ribbon.
