

Purpose: The purpose of this conference is to promote communication and dissemination of performance improvement projects and nursing research that is being conducted in diverse academic, clinical, and/or community settings throughout Florida.

Benefits/Values to Presenting Your Projects and/or Research:

- Develop your statewide reputation
- Associate your name with your specific topic/research/project
- Network and collaborate with other nurse researchers in your field
- Promote your research in academia/clinical/community settings
- Open up potential job opportunities
- Obtain feedback on your findings from peers, which may be helpful in developing or improving your future research work

Presenting your work is invaluable not only to the attendees who discuss the content with you but also for yourself because of the benefits and values this experience brings.

Eligibility:

- Performance improvement/quality improvement clinical projects and evidence-based nursing research projects are eligible for podium or poster presentation.
- Research conducted in practice and/or as part of educational endeavors is eligible for presentation.
- Research must be completed by time of submission to be eligible for podium presentations.
- In-progress and completed projects are eligible for poster presentations.
- Literature reviews and concept analyses and similar will be considered for poster presentations.
- Students and nurses in practice/academics/research/etc. are eligible and encouraged to submit.

Abstract Format:

- **For blinded peer-review purposes, please place the last four digits of your social security number at top of abstract. Do NOT put your name on your abstract.**
- Document Requirements:
 - The abstract must be submitted in Word format.
 - Word Count: Abstracts should have a **maximum of 300 words. Abstracts exceeding the maximum word count will NOT be reviewed.** Titles are *not* included in word count. Headings *are* included.
 - Font: Abstracts should be typed in Times Roman font with a type no smaller than 12 point font.
 - Paragraph: The body of the abstract should be single spaced with double spacing between paragraphs. Left justify all paragraphs; do not indent to begin a paragraph.
 - Headings: If you would like to use headings, make sure you bold them. Heading examples such as Objective, Background, Methodology, Analysis, etc. may be used. *Headings are included in word count.*
- If the project or research was supported in full or in part by a grant, please cite the grant number and granting organization at the bottom of the abstract.
- **Please comply with all requirements to ensure your abstract is submitted for peer-review.** Peer-review will be conducted by members of the FNA Research Special Interest Group (SIG).

Submission Requirements:

- Complete and submit your abstract, abstract submission form and BIO/COI form **no later than Friday, May 10, 2019**.
- If there is more than one person presenting for either podium or posters, a BIO/COI form must be completed for each presenter.
- Peer-review on all submitted abstracts will be conducted from May 13 – May 24, 2019.
- Notification of acceptance will be no later than Friday, May 31, 2019 (Person who submitted abstract will be officially notified).
- If your abstract is accepted, you will have until **June 7th** to register for the conference.

Poster Presentations:

- Poster size no larger than 4 ft. x 8 ft. (48" x 96").
- FNA will provide poster display boards and pins to hang poster.
- You can prepare a handout summarizing your work with key findings, links to more information, and providing your contact information. Handouts are optional.
- Practice in sharing your story... "Tell me about your project."
- Poster presenters are encouraged to stay for the entire conference.

Podium Presentations:

- Presentations will be one hour in length.
- Once notified of your podium acceptance, complete an objective form and submit **no later than Friday, June 14, 2019**. Objective forms will be attached with your notification of acceptance email.
- PowerPoint presentations will need to be submitted **no later than Friday, July 5, 2019**.
- Podium presenters are encouraged to stay for the entire conference.
