

HB 825 “Administration of Vaccines” by Rep. Fernandez-Barquin

- This bill amends pharmacy vaccination laws by deleting “adult immunization schedule”
- By deleting the specification of “adult”, this bill aligns state statute with the Federal Center for Disease Control’s recommended immunization schedule to include immunizations for children and adolescents¹
- This legislation gives greater access to immunizations for children and adolescents
- Florida is 1 in only 4 states that don’t allow pharmacists to immunize patients under years old²
