Georgia A. Pasqualone was a critical care and emergency department nurse for more than 45 years. She was self-employed as a forensic nurse consultant, investigator and lecturer. She retired as a lieutenant colonel in the Army Nurse Corps after 22 years of service, both active and reserve. She received her bachelor's degree in nursing from Boston University and her master's degree in forensic nursing from Fitchburg State College. She also received a master's degree in forensic science from the University of New Haven, having studied with Dr. Henry Lee. She was a certified emergency nurse, certified forensic nurse, a legal nurse consultant, crime scene investigator and a professional photographer with specialty training in forensic photography. She served as a forensic nurse liaison and consultant for the Police Department in Waltham, Mass. She was also a forensic nursing consultant with the Department of Justice, in Concord, NH, and provided assistance to the Attorney General in child abuse and shaken baby cases. She has lectured internationally (Africa and the Ukraine) on topics concerning forensic nursing, domestic violence, sexual assault and forensic photography. She has published extensively as well as her research on the categories of forensic patients.

There is a scholarship in Georgia's name at Fitchburg State University-for the forensic nursing program that she started.
