Foursquare ITP recently completed a transit vision plan for Central Maryland that developed a network of 30 corridors, local network improvements, and supporting strategies, offering best practices for others.

<u>Concurrent Session:</u> Developing MARTA's COVID-19 Essential Service Plan Olen Daelhousen, VHB

Attendees will learn how VHB assisted MARTA in developing an Essential Bus Service Plan that addressed the drastic drop in transit ridership during the COVID-19 pandemic, while accounting for the needs of a vulnerable, bus-dependent population. The quantitative framework developed allowed MARTA to respond to ridership changes and social distancing guidelines.

Athens-Clarke County Transit is finalizing a decades-long Bus Stop Improvement and Art Shelter Program designed to make transit service more efficient and enjoyable for everyone, and presenters will outline the process, highlight successes and provide insight on avoiding pitfalls. In the area of bus route planning, Foursquare ITP will discuss its work developing a bus priority program for Washington, DC that creates a toolbox of treatments and a pipeline of bus priority corridor projects.

<u>Concurrent Session:</u> Using Technology to Improve Small Urban and Rural Transit Shana Johnson, Reinaldo Germano, Foursquare ITP

Presenters will offer detail on two recently-completed projects that impact the delivery of rural transit. First, Foursquare ITP will discuss its recently released "The Promising Practices Guidebook: Transit Technology Adoption for the National Center for Applied Transit Technology (N-CATT)," which aimed to illuminate how small-urban, rural, and tribal transit agencies have adopted technological solutions and new service delivery models within their service areas and with comparatively limited resources. Secondly, Foursquare ITP also developed a transit service inventory and assessment covering the 420 counties across 13 states (including Georgia) served by the Appalachian Regional Commission. Presenters will discuss best practices learned from both projects.

The City of Valdosta is using GA Smart Communities Challenge grant funding to pilot a

smart traffic management system connecting all 128 city traffic signals, with enhancements to the system including hardware and software upgrades at signals and in the traffic control operations center. This project has potential to illustrate how traffic signal priority technology can be used to benefit transit systems across the state.
