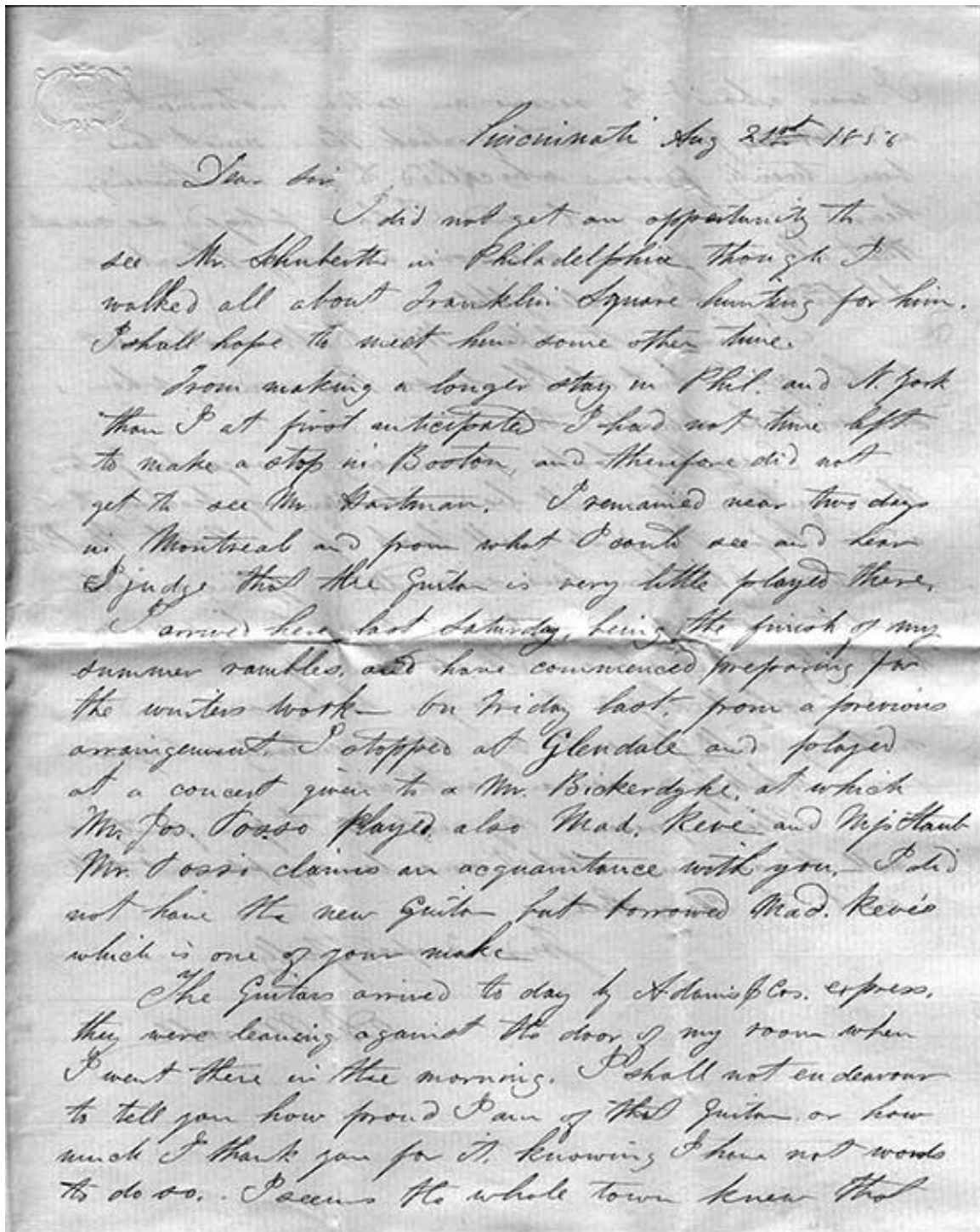


Sbs-02.Worrall-5
