PUBLIC INTEREST FELLOWSHIPS - SUMMER 2019 OVERVIEW**

The Hispanic Bar Association of DC Foundation (“HBA-DC Foundation”) is pleased to announce fellowship opportunities to support public interest legal work during the summer of 2019. The HBA-DC Foundation will award one or more fellowships in an amount between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

Eligibility Criteria: This fellowship is intended to support law students working with a public interest organization in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area in a position that is otherwise not compensated by the sponsoring entity.

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must be: (1) a first or second- year law student (JD) in good standing; (2) actively enrolled in, and attending, one of the following accredited law schools located in the District of Columbia or its immediate suburbs: the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America, Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University, George Washington University Law School, Georgetown University Law Center, Howard University School of Law, the David A. Clarke School of Law at the University of the District of Columbia, or the Washington College of Law at American University; and (3) with an arrangement to work full-time for a minimum of eight weeks with a sponsoring entity. The sponsoring organization must be all the following: (1) a not-for-profit, non-governmental organization; (2) located in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan area; (3) providing advocacy or direct legal services to persons in the D.C. metro area; (4) at low cost or no cost to the clients. Preference will be given to students who will provide advocacy or direct legal services to low-income individuals with sponsoring organizations that serve the Latino community in Washington, DC.

 - (3) One recommendation letter from a law professor, former employer, or other professional/educational reference (if the letter is e-mailed separately from the application package, it must be received by the HBA-DC Foundation by midnight on April 26, 2019 in order to be considered);
 - (4) Your current resume;
 - (5) Complete financial information worksheet for academic year 2018-2019 (Section IV);
