What is the Robyn Carr Cup for Excellence in Nursing Informatics?

In 1990 five forward thinking nurses, one of whom was Theatre Nurse Robyn Carr, attended the International Nursing Informatics conference in Melbourne. Following this event, in 1991 they organised the first Nursing Informatics Conference in New Zealand, and then having identified other interested nurses, established Nursing Informatics New Zealand (NINZ).

Robyn Carr led the evolving NINZ and went on to become New Zealand's international representative and eventually became World Chair of the Nursing Informatics Special Interest Group of the International Medical Informatics Association Nursing Informatics Special Interest Group (IMIA-NI). Robyn Carr was a leader in bringing NINZ into a permanent relationship with the New Zealand Health Informatics Foundation and, as a result, HINZ emerged as the national body embracing and guiding the role of informatics in the wider health industry in New Zealand.

The Robyn Carr Cup, provided by Robyn Carr, was established in 2010, to provide encouragement for nurses and their involvement with nursing informatics, to continue the legacy of her pioneering role in New Zealand. This award recognises sustained support of nursing informatics in New Zealand. Furthermore it recognises the central role nurses have had, and continue to have, in supporting the profession, each other and the wider interests of the health informatics community.


