AIM Annual Survey – 2013

(N = 60)

Purpose: assess and characterize immunization program policy, infrastructure, program activities and priorities and the impact of funding changes (both federal and state) on immunization programs

Administered online January-March 2014

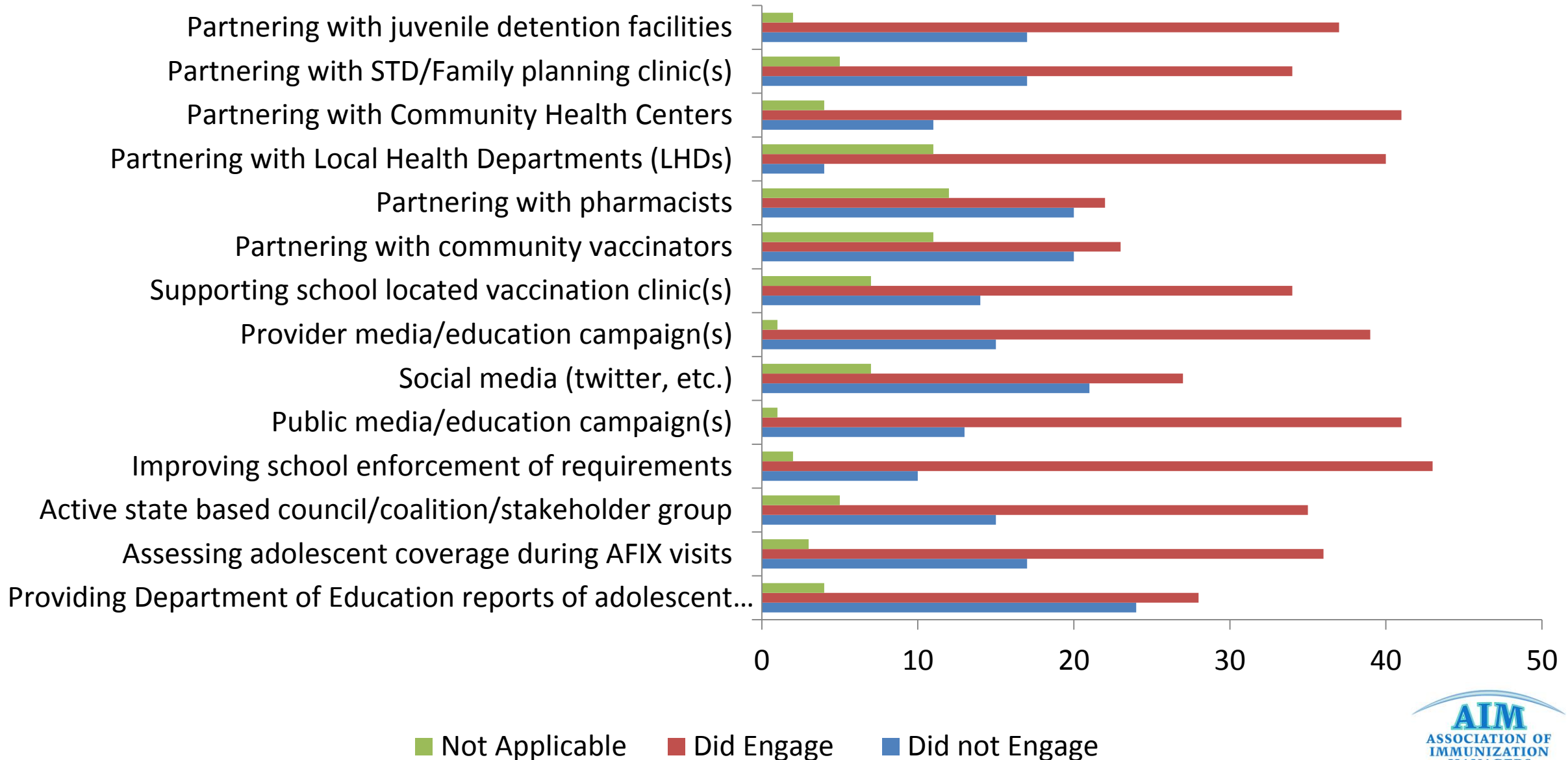
- 2013 Grant Year (GY13) Funds (does not include PPHF)
- 2013 Calendar Year (CY13) Activities
- Current Policies
- 2014 Priorities

Immunization Program: Adolescent Activities and Support

- 63% (34 of 60) conduct Adolescent AFIX visits
- 66% (40 of 60) have an adolescent staff person in position
- 8 Immunization Programs awarded \$2.1 million in PPHF to focus on Adolescent Immunizations using IIS
 - MI, MN, NV, NM, ND, OR, WA and NYC (2012)
 - e.g., AFIX, reminder recall, etc.

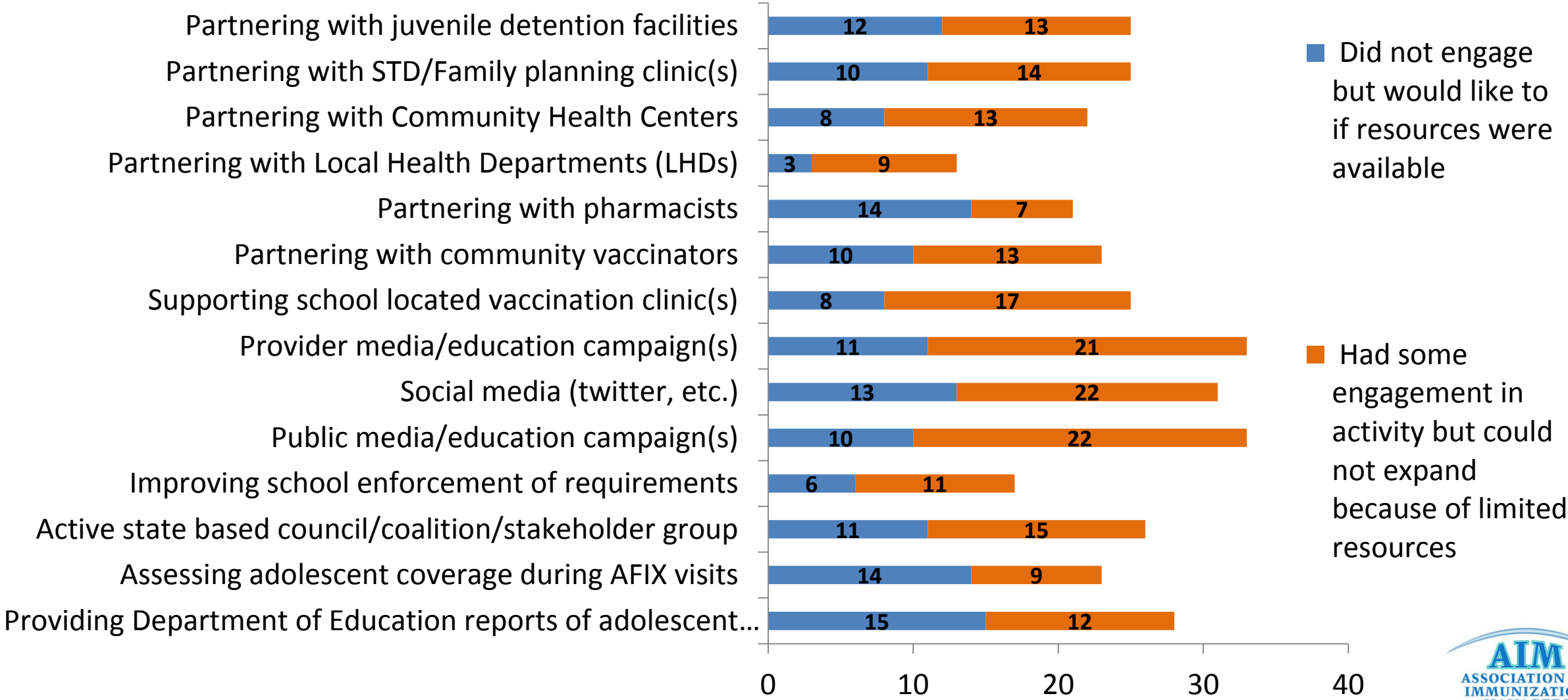
Activities: Engagement to Increase ADOLESCENT Vaccination Rates (CY13)
