A Conversation with Making A Murderer's Jerry Buting – 1 hr. CLE

Jerome F. Buting is a shareholder at the Brookfield, Wis. firm Buting Williams & Stilling. He received his undergraduate degree in forensic studies from Indiana University and his J.D. from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is a past board director of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, past president of the Wisconsin Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, and past chair of the Wisconsin State Bar Criminal Law Section. His present private practice is entirely criminal defense, both trials and appeals. He has defended the citizen accused in many serious, high-profile trial cases, including the Steven Avery case, as shown in Netflix's *Making A Murderer* documentary series. He also obtained the reversal of convictions in *State of Wisconsin v. Ted Oswald* and *State of Wisconsin v. Ralph Armstrong* (reversing a 25-year-old murder conviction). He lectures worldwide and is frequently sought after for his knowledge in the use of expert witnesses and DNA evidence.
