Stop the Spread of Antibiotic Resistance

[The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention \(CDC\)](#) reports that "each year in the United States, at least 2 million people become infected with bacteria that are resistant to antibiotics, and at least 23,000 people die each year as a direct result of these infections." A growing number of infections are antibiotic resistant. Antibiotic-resistant infections are spreading between healthcare facilities -- even facilities that are practicing infection control and antibiotic stewardship. Connecting with Caregivers: Allies in Recovery and Wellness

As a provider of integrated primary and behavioral health care, you are likely to interact with caregivers during appointments or as part of your care coordination efforts. Caregivers seek information about the person's illness, the service system and resources to support a friend or relative. Health care organizations can take steps to create an environment that is supportive of and appropriately engages caregivers as part of the care team. Here are a few key resources that can help:

Tool for Coding Social Determinants of Health

FINANCE AND OPERATIONS

Connected Care: The Chronic Care Conditions Resource

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has implemented a resource guide entitled

Connected Care that is dedicated to assisting providers in the administration of Chronic Care Management (CCM). CCM is referred to those with two or more chronic conditions. The goal of the Connected Care initiative is for health care professionals to learn about the benefits of CCM and take steps to offer CCM services to eligible patients. MIPs Update

FQHCs are presently not required to participate in MIPs, but providers may if they render Part B services outside of the FQHCs and exceed the minimal volume threshold. Providers who exceed the threshold are those who serve more than 100 Medicare beneficiaries or more than \$30,000 in Medicare charges annually. CMS has launched a look-up tool so providers can verify whether they met their part B threshold. Click [here](#) to learn more details and click [here](#) for the look-up/threshold tool.

Provider Location Linkage and EOB 1010

The IHCP requires all providers are linked to the respective location where services are rendered, or they will receive an EOB 1010. Claims that receive an EOB of 1010 will still adjudicate and pay until September 1 2017. Claims received on September 1 and beyond will deny until the provider information is appropriately updated. Hewlett Packard Enterprises (HPE) merges with CSC to form DXC Technology

Hewlett Packard Enterprises (HPE) merged with CSC to form DXC Technology. Providers will begin to see communications referring to DXC rather than HPE moving forward. Please click [here](#) to see the official notice.

State Medicaid Expansion Match (Formerly Automation Update)

The State/FSSA is attempting to find the easiest means to identify the RIDs/encounters per the Medicaid expansion population. In March, the State released a memo to FQHCs mandating they send payment vouchers with MCE claims data effective 4/1. Because of the significant push back presented by IPHCA and FQHCs, the FSSA has agreed to push the implementation start date back to 6/1 claims paid on the 7/20 MCE claims report. The FSSA plans to go live if the MCE file is above 90% correct per health center. The State is pursuing the option of sending encounters/files which were not on the initial month's file and allowing the missing encounters to be included for the following month. If feasible, it's unclear at what error threshold this would be implemented. According to the FSSA, the first MCE reports for April should have been received by 5/20 thus beginning the pilot period.

2017-2018 NHSC Scholar Score Requirement

HRSA has determined that a minimum Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) score of 17 for assignment of all service-ready National Health Service Corps (NHSC) scholars is necessary for HRSA to meet its statutory obligation to identify a number of entities eligible for NHSC scholar placement that is at least equal to, but not greater than, twice the number of NHSC scholars available to serve in the 2017-2018 placement cycle. HRSA is also posting the proposed listing of entities and associated HPSA scores that will receive priority for assignment of NHSC Scholarship recipients available for service during the period October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, on the [Health Workforce Connector website](#) (formerly known as the NHSC Jobs Center).
