



African Governance Showcase Awards Ceremony 2017

On the 1st of November 2017, the IoDSA, in collaboration with the International Finance Corporation (IFC) and the Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO) hosted the African Governance Showcase awards ceremony.

The African Governance Showcase is a case study competition which encourages global submissions from participants on all areas of African corporate governance. The case studies must be based on corporate governance cases in Africa, within organisations which could be expected to, or chose to, apply the principles contained in the King Reports on Corporate Governance in South Africa or the relevant corporate governance codes of the country within which the organisation operates.

Professor Mervyn King addressed the attendees and awarded the prizes for the winning and top three case studies submissions.

In first place was South African Matthew Marrian for his case study African Bank Investment Ltd (ABIL): A South African corporate governance failure.

In second place, Ghanaian authors Elikplimi Komla Agbloyor, Joshua Yindenaba Abor and Lydia Adzobu received an award for the case study Corporate governance at SIC Company Limited.

Carol Musyoka and Evalyne Mugo hailing from Kenya, received the third place award for the case study From a desk to the board room: How Equity Bank morphed into a regional stallion jockeyed by good governance.
