Hactivism

Recent news was dominated by cyber attacks and successful hacking of organisations as diverse as Sony, NASA and the SABC.

- A Chinese military unit was identified as a culprit hacking commercial and state organs to get competitive information.
- The activist group "Anonymous" and its associates target companies and state organs that are perceived to mistreat its customers or clients, by hacking into and taking control of their computer systems to achieve a particular end. This is activism by hacking or "hactivism".

The Pentagon is subjected to more than three million hacking attempts per day and up to 90% of all e-mails coming into a medium-sized South African company consists of spam.

Most South African organisations live in complete ignorance, but the RUDE AWAKENING is the fact that no one is immune to this insidious form of attack.
