WHO'S ON THE BALLOT FOR THE GENERAL ELECTION?

(Primary Election was March 20, 2018)

General Election – November 6, 2018

Early Voting began September 27, 2018

- **Representatives in 116th Congress** (all 18 districts) to be sworn in January 3, 2019 for a two-year term (Illinois current composition: 10 Democrats and 8 Republicans)
- **State Constitutional Officers** – Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller, Treasurer to be sworn in 2nd Monday in January (1/14/19) for a four-year term.
- **State 101st General Assembly Members:**
 - Representatives (all 118 districts) to be sworn in the 2nd Wednesday in January (1/9/19) for a two-year term. (Current composition: 67 Democrats, 51 Republicans – total 118 seats)
 - Senators (two-thirds of the 59 districts) to be sworn in 2nd Wednesday of January (1/9/19) for a four-year term. (Current composition: 37 Democrats, 22 Republicans – total 59 seats)
 - Senate districts having an election this November in numerical order: 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 15, 17, 18, 20, 21, 23, 24, 26, 27, 29, 30, 32, 33, 35, 36, 38, 39, 41, 42, 44, 45, 47, 48, 50, 51, 53, 54, 56, 57, 59.
 - Four-year term (Group Two): 2,5,8,11,14,17,20,23,26,29,32,35,38,41,44,47,50,53,56,59
