**Getting to Baltimore by Car**

Please enter the above address into your navigation system.

Visitor parking is available at several locations on the Johns Hopkins medical campus (see map, above) for a reasonable fee. For your security, please do not park in unsecured locations off-campus.

**Getting to Baltimore by Air/Train**

*Baltimore-Washington International Airport (BWI)* is just west of Baltimore and the closest option for air travel.

Getting to Baltimore from BWI:

Taxi (appr. \$45)

Uber or other ridesharing app (appr. \$30)

Light rail (\$1.60, drop-off in the Baltimore Inner Harbor area)

*Newark International Airport (EWR)* is distant from Baltimore but has many direct international connections. Some flights into Newark can be quite cheap, and a simple rail connection is available to Baltimore.

Take the Amtrak (Train) from the airport station to downtown Baltimore (Penn Station). The trip takes about 2 to 2.5 hours. Purchased in advance at [amtrak.com](http://amtrak.com), one-way fare is appr. \$60-\$70.

*Philadelphia International Airport (PHL)*: Baltimore is accessible by rail from the Philadelphia International Airport, but one must connect in downtown Philadelphia. Transfer would take about 2 hours.

*Washington, DC-area Airports*

*Dulles International Airport (IAD) and Reagan Airport (DCA) in Washington, DC* offer many international and regional connections.

Unfortunately, public transportation from these airports to Baltimore remains complicated, with multiple transfers necessary.

Ride-sharing can be used starting from around \$80 for a one-hour drive, but during the lengthy morning and evening commutes, the price increases and the drive to Baltimore can take two hours or more.

### **Getting around Baltimore**

To travel between the medical campus and the areas mentioned above, please take a taxi/car, hotel shuttle, or bus. Do not walk. The Charm City Circulator is a free bus service that visits the Johns Hopkins campus: <http://www.charmcitycirculator.com/>

### **Safety and Security**

Baltimore is a vibrant and interesting city. As with any large city, there are certain security considerations and some areas you may want to avoid.

Johns Hopkins University Security has a strong presence on the medical campus, with guardhouses every few blocks. Do not walk in the area immediately off campus, especially after dark. If you become the victim of a robbery, do not argue or fight back. Surrender your belongings, observe the perpetrator carefully, and report the incident to police (phone 911) immediately. The areas mentioned under “hotels” are quite safe for visitors.

### **Weather**

Weather around the end of March in Baltimore is unpredictable, from snowy and freezing to sunny and 80 F/27 C. Please consult the local weather forecast before traveling and plan your wardrobe accordingly.
