Young people, family relationships and civic participation

**Abstract:** This article examines young people's civic participation and the extent to which this is influenced by the family. Although literature on young people's civic participation is abundant, the role of the family in influencing this participation is largely absent. Drawing on survey data collected from 976 young people aged 13–14 in South Wales, we outline the extent and nature of civic participation and how this varies according to relationships with parents and grandparents. Our data show that relationships with mothers and grandparents are particularly important in young people's accounts of their participation, suggesting that family is far more important in developing a propensity for engagement in civil society than is commonly understood.

**摘要:** 本文探討了青年公民參與及其受家庭影響的程度。雖然關於青年公民參與的文獻很豐富，但是關於家庭對其參與影響的研究卻很少。基於對南威爾士 976 名年齡在 13-14 歲的青年的調查數據，我們概述了他們公民參與的程度和性質以及其參與程度如何隨著與父母和祖父母的關係而變化。我們的數據顯示，青年與母親和祖父母的關係在其對參與的解釋中尤為重要，這表明家庭在促進公民社會參與方面比我們通常理解的要重要得多。

The New Strengthened Regulations of INGOs in India and China: Comparative Analysis and Reflections

新加強的印度和中國對於國際非政府組織的管制：比較分析與思考

**Abstract:** While globalization creates an ambitious space for NGOs to play a large role in policy-making and problem-solving the concern about their accountability always remains there. As the biggest developing countries, India and China have attracted lots of international aid and INGOs' attention. Recently, both have taken serious efforts to regulate or even to control INGOs' influence in domestic context despite the difference of their political systems. It is worthy of comparative analysis in a nuanced way on their similarities and differences of why and how to regulate. As a reflection, it is also a good moment for relevant stakeholders to re-imagine the global governance and their relevant role.

**摘要：** 儘管全球化為非政府組織在政策制定和問題解決方面發揮重要作用創造了一個大有可為的空間，但對其問責性的關注始終存在。作為最大的兩個發展中國家，印度和中國吸引了大量國際援助機構和國際非政府組織的關注。最近，儘管有著不同的政治制度，中印兩國都做出很大的努力來管控甚至控制國際非政府組織在國內的影響，因此很有必要對兩國為什麼及其如何管控國際非政府組織的相同點和不同點進行細致的比較分析。作為反思，利益相關方也應該重新想象全球治理及其相關的影響。

#### From Nonprofit Leader to Elected Official: Examining Political Ambition in the Nonprofit Sector

從非營利領導到當選官員：審視非營利部門中的政治雄心

**Abstract:** To what extent do leaders of nonprofit organizations run for elected office? We address this question through an exploratory study using survey data from a random sample of 184 leaders of nonprofit human service organizations in the United States. Drawing upon theories of political ambition, we explore the factors that may shape nascent political ambition (propensity to run) as well as expressive political ambition (running for office). We find that nonprofit leaders are no more likely to run for office than the average citizen, but interest in running is much more common. We identify several individual-level and professional socialization factors associated with political ambition. Our study makes an important theoretical contribution by outlining a model of political ambition for the nonprofit sector that can be tested in future studies, and makes an important practical contribution by highlighting ways that associations and nonprofit industry groups might convert nascent ambition into expressive ambition.

**摘要：**非營利組織的領導者在多大程度上會去競選公職？我們通過一項探索性研究來回答這個問題，該研究使用來自對美國 184 個非營利性公眾服務組織領導者的隨機樣本調查數據。基於政治雄心理論，我們探索可能影響早期政治抱負（從政傾向）以及表達政治雄心（競選公職）的因素。我們發現，非營利組織領導者並不會比普通公民更想去競選公職，但對競選的興趣更為普遍。我們識別出了與政治野心相關的幾個個人層面和專業社會化因素。我們的研究通過構建出一個未來可被檢測的非營利部門領導的政治野心模型而做出重要的理論貢獻，並通過強調非營利性行業協會和團體可能將早期的政治抱負轉變為表達政治野心而做出重要的實踐貢獻。

Why do nongovernmental organizations face difficulty creating lasting change? How can they be more effective? In this book, Cristina Balboa examines NGO authority, capacity, and accountability to propose that a “paradox of scale” is a primary barrier to NGO effectiveness. This paradox—when what gives an NGO authority on one scale also weakens its authority on another scale—helps explain how NGOs can be seen as an authority on particular causes on a global scale, but then fail to effect change at the local level. - The connection between the transformations of domestic economic development strategies and accumulation regimes on the one hand, and the expansion and globalization of China's reach, on the other. In particular, what are the economic and political goals of the expansion of Chinese capital beyond "accumulation for accumulation's sake"? (Lee 2017: 7);
- How China's increasingly global reach and the expansion of Chinese capital has been received and represented at the levels of political and business elites, as well as ordinary citizens;
- How various flows and networks of migrants articulate with and rework the local political economies and the relationship between formal and informal labor and migration regimes and how this can be related to networks of accumulation, as well as to contentious politics;
- The changing politics and industry of migration: roles of brokers, migration infrastructures, trade unions, etc.;
- How these flows alter the relationship between different generations of (im)migrants, the politics of ethnicity and identity, and the relationship with the Chinese state; what roles do the various Chinese associations and networks play in these economic, political, and cultural processes?
- The transformation of the Chinese state's representation of international Chinese migrants and how this resonates with changing economic development paradigms and strategies in foreign policy.

## **The Special Issue**

We encourage academics to further explore the role of context in social entrepreneurship research in Asia. Social entrepreneurs can include individuals in the community, business people and government officials who are adopting a social entrepreneurial mindset to solve social problems or seeking to create social impact.

Research papers should be theory-driven with novel empirical content. Use of case studies, historical analyses and comparative analyses is strongly encouraged. Empirical work using surveys, experiments and big data is also welcome.

The special issue seeks to advance scholarly understanding of social entrepreneurship in the Asia Pacific context. Social entrepreneurship, as the application of commercial logic to create social value (Dacin et al., 2011; Doherty et al., 2014), has been gaining prominence in the Asia Pacific region over the past several decades (Kerlin, 2017; Chandra & Wong, 2016). This can be seen in the increasing number of academic exchanges, forums and conferences, as well as scholars doing work in the field in this region. Social entrepreneurship can be seen as a mindset as well as a specific tool that can emerge in the community, business and government sectors – a broadened view that may spark new ways of understanding the phenomenon.

Despite the burgeoning interest, systematic research on social entrepreneurship remains dominated by those from Western institutions and political systems. We know little about how context plays a role in shaping the practices, discourses and policies of social entrepreneurship in the Asia Pacific region. For instance, does social entrepreneurship exert a policy influence on the government in Asia (or vice versa)? What is the role of Asia's politics, religion/religiosity, culture and language on the practice of social entrepreneurship? What kinds of policies have been detrimental (as well as constructive?) in influencing the growth of social entrepreneurship in Asia? These are only some of the interesting questions that have yet to receive systematic investigation.
