

Should I get ITIL® 4 certified? (By Bob Rice, President of the itSMFusa Atlanta LIG)

ITIL® 4 was formally released on February 28, 2019. The ITIL® 4 Foundation certification is currently available with the advanced certifications planned for 2019 Q4. But what about those who are in the process of ITIL® v3 certification? Should they wait for the rest of ITIL® 4, or continue along the path they have already begun?

First, a couple of important points about the ITIL® 4 certification scheme:

- Unlike ITIL® v3, there is not an ITIL® 4 Foundation Bridge certification and exam. However, some training vendors are offering an abbreviated ITIL® 4 Foundation class as a bridge class for those that have the ITIL® v3 Foundation certification and are very familiar with it.
- The “Managing Professional (MP) Transition certification will act as the ITIL® 4 bridge certification and exam for people who have achieved either the ITIL® v3 Expert certification OR have achieved at least 17 points in the ITIL® v3 accreditation scheme. (That means you don’t have to be an ITIL® v3 Expert to take this certification.)

What will drive your decision about continuing with ITIL® v3 certification versus starting ITIL® 4 certification if you already have an investment in ITIL® v3? The simplest answer is, “time”. The ITIL® 4 advanced certifications will not be released until 2019 Q4. The existing ITIL® v3 certification scheme will continue to be available for some time after that. AXELOS has committed to providing at least 6 months advanced notice before discontinuing the ITIL® v3 certification scheme, so it is reasonable to expect that ITIL® v3 certification will be around for a while. During the transition from ITIL® v2 to ITIL® v3, there was a 1 year overlap where both certifications were available. If that holds true for the ITIL® v3 to ITIL® 4 overlap, then it is reasonable to expect that the ITIL® v3 scheme will be available through the end of 2020.

For example, if it reasonable for you to reach 17 credits prior to the discontinuance of the ITIL® v3 certification stream, then that is probably the best route to continue, especially if you are within 2 or 3 courses/certifications. Then taking the ITIL® 4 Managing Professional Transition course and certification exam would allow you to “bridge” to the ITIL® 4 equivalent certification/designation. Otherwise, to reach the ITIL® 4 Managing Professional certification/designation level will require 5 ITIL® 4 courses (including ITIL® 4 Foundation), effectively starting over with ITIL® 4.

There are 2 “designations” that are supported by certifications in ITIL® 4. They are 1) ITIL® Managing Professional (MP), and 2) ITIL® Strategic Leader (SL). To achieve each designation, you must obtain the supporting certifications.
