## **BHR- Behavioral Health Response**

Local Community mental health center. 24 hrs, 7 days a week. Provides free “confidential telephone counseling to people in mental health crisis as well as mobile outreach services.”

## **Access Crisis Intervention (ACI) Missouri Department of Mental Health**

Mental health professionals are available to talk to anyone facing a crisis 24 hours a day, 7 days per week; mental health professionals provide understanding and support through telephone conversations, and help determine the type of assistance the person in crisis needs.
