



JAINA



JAINA is an acronym for the Federation of Jain Associations in North America, an umbrella organization of 71 Jain Centers representing 150,000 members in the USA and Canada; with a mission to preserve, practice, and promote Jain Dharma and Jain Way of Life. It was founded in 1981 and formalized in 1983. JAINA is the largest organization of Jains outside India and conducts its various programs and initiatives through 36 committees. The dream of unity of all Jains is alive and thriving in North America through JAINA, as it represents Jains of all sects from all regions of the world.

OBJECTIVES

- 1 To assist in the establishment of Jain Temples, Sthanaks, Pathshalas, and other facilities for carrying on Jain activities.
- ² To assist existing Jain associations and promote the formation of new Jain associations throughout North America.
- 3. To promote religious and educational activities related to Jainism and to develop a better understanding of the Jain religion.
- 4. To assist and promote charitable and humanitarian community services in North America, India, and throughout the world.
- 5. To promote vegetarianism and non-violence.
- 6. To provide and promote academic and cultural interchanges and cooperation among Jains in North America, India, and other countries around the globe.
- 7 To establish liaison with governmental and other agencies in pursuance of the above objectives.

ORGANIZATION

There are over 71 Organizations under the JAINA Umbrella. Each Jain Center, based on its membership size, appoints one, two, or three Directors as their representatives at JAINA. There are 120 JAINA Directors. The directors elect the JAINA Executive Committee members every two years.

Parshwanath Temple, Mevanagar, Nakoda, Rajasthan



Surrounded on all sides by the profuse natural beauty, the ancient Jain Nakoda Parshwanath temple is situated against the Aravalli mountain range of Rajasthan. It is like an oasis in the famous desert

of Barmer. The tall 58 cm black idol of Lord Parshwanath in Padmasana adorns the white temple. The temple has attained a great fame as a very popular place of pilgrimage for all devout Jains.

According to mythology the Jain King Viramdutt and his brother Nakorsen had established a Jain temple in Virampur in 3rd BC. It was dedicated to the eighth Tirthankar Chandraprabhuji. The temple was renovated by the king Samprati in Vikram Purva 189. But later on the image of 24th Tirthankar Mahavir Swami remained as the main deity of the temple till 1166 A.D. During the invasion by the Mughal Emperor Alamshah in 1224 A.D. all the idols of God were safely hidden below Kalidrah lake of Nakoda (Virampur) vil-lage. In 1373 A. D., the black idol of Parshwanath was found from the lake. Once again Nakoda temple became famous after the reestablishment of the idol. But there was another invasion by Mughal King Babijan (Babashah) in 1387 A.D.

It is believed that Virampur came to life in 1455 AD, when Parshwanath's idol was restored once again from the lake. With the efforts of Shri. KirtiratnaSuriji adorned the tem-ple of Virampur. An Unusual incident took place in the beginning of the 18th Century. The prince of the place cut the long hair of Nagarseth Nangaji Sankhlecha. Consequently, Nanagrseth along with 2700 Jain families left the place on pretext of pilgrimage and settled in Jaisalmer and the surrounding villages. Once again Nakoda became a deserted place till the mid 20th century. The symbolic dream of God Bharavdevii resulted in 'Jirnoddhar' (renovation) by Shri. Sudarshriji around 1904 A.D. Nakoda within no time attained the prestige of a famous place of pilgrimage with the remarkable construction of Mahavir Smriti Bhavan Mangal Kalas, Samvasaran Mandir near the main Nakoda temple. Lots of Jain followers have been attending the 3-day unique celebration every year on the birthday of Lord Parshwanath

There is a motorable road to Nakoda Tirth. The nearest railway station of Balotra is 13 km away.

Shree Rhushbhdev Temple, Shantigram-Ahmedabad, Gujarat



A temple dedicated to Shree Rishabhdev (1st Tirthankara) is designed on the principals of Nagara Temple Architecture. It is located in Adani Shantigram which is Gujarat's largest

integrated township near Vaishnodevi Circle in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. It took about 42000 man-hours for its completion, using 70000 cubic-feet Makrana White Marble and it is completely constructed by ancient techniques of using hand chiseled solid stones. There is not a single steel bar

is used in the whole construction. Construction started in February 2013 and Pratishtha was done on 20th April 2017.

Mulnayak Statue of Bhagwan Rhushbdev is 63 inch height. There are amenities of Bhojanshala, Dharamshala, Sadhu m.s. Upashray, Sadhviji m.s. Upashray and Open Campus of 130 feet x 80 feet (Can be used for Religious functions.) Girbha Griha & Central prayer hall are one of the largest in Ahmedabad with a total height of 90 feet.

The Interiors and exterior both have very rich cultural heritage diversity in design. Each sculpture is designed with a unique posture. Arches are adorned with Peacocks & leafy patterns. The ceilings are very unique especially "Om" and "Hrim" which were inspired by the famous Ranakpur temple.

As the sun sets and when monumental lightings are on, the whole temple looks like a Golden serene palace and one surely falls in love with the art and architecture of this sacred place.

Pavagadh hill, -Halol taluka of Panchmahal district in Gujarat



The Pavagadh Tirth is located on Pavagadh hill 925 meter above sea level. Its presiding Tirthankara is Lord Parshwanath, in the Padmasana posture. In 1484 AD, it was heavily damaged during invasion

of Champaner by Sultan Mahmood Shah I (Mahmood Begado). On the thirteenth day of the bright half of the month of Magh, in 1880 AD the temple was repaired and formally rededicated under the auspices of Bhattarak, Kankakirth Maharaj. Every year on that day, a fair is held ere, and a flag is hoisted on the temple.

There was a time when Pavagadh Tirth was considered to be as holy as the Shetrunjaya temple. There is a reference that Lav and Kush, the sons of Ramchandra of Ayodhya and a number of monks also practised Penance here and attained salvation. The Place is therefore known as Siddhakshetra. This place is known for the power of Kalika Devi, the Shashan Devi of Achal Gachhadhisatayika.

At present there are seven other Digambar temples on the hill and in Champaner town at its foot. Ruins of ancient temples and relics of extraordinary craftsmanship can be found at this site. Natural beauty is also in abundance. The caves of Pavagadh are also worth seeing.

The nearest railway station is Pavagadh on the vadodara-Delhi line, 53 km from Vadodara. The nearest Airport in Vadodara, Champaner is well connected by road to Halol and other nearby taluka and district headquarters and frequent buses are available. Pilgrims must climb the 5 km hill path on foot. There are Dharmashalas and Bhojanshalas at the base of the hill.

Shri Ajitnath Bhagwan, Taranga, Mehsana district, Gujarat



Taranga became an important Jain pilgrimage site in the 12th century. In Kumarapala Pratibodha of Somapra-bhacharya, composed in Vikram Samvat 1241, it states that the local Buddhist king Veni

Vatsaraja and Jain monk Khaputacharya had built a temple for goddess Tara and thus the town was named Tarapur.

The hill is for the most part covered with brushwood and forest on the east and west. Crossed by a road that leads to a plateau where you will find the temples built of white sandstone and brick. The main temple was built by Chaulukya king Kumarapala (1143 - 1174) after he became a follower of Jainism under his teacher Acharya Hem-chandra.

Ajitanatha Jain temple

In the center of the main square of the length of 230 ft (70 m) and the breadth 230 ft (70 m), this temple is 50-foot (15 m) long, 100-foot (30 m) broad and 142-foot (43 m) high. It has a perimeter of 639 ft (195 m). The 902 ft (275 m) high wooden summit of this temple is beautifully carved.

The red interior of the temple 2.75 m white marble figure of Ajitnath, the second Tirthankara seated in the shrine, decorated with precious stones let into the marble. The features wear the usual expression of deep repose or quiet covert scorn. On the right hand side of the temple, there are footprints of Rishabha and of the 20 Tirthankaras and on the left hand side, there are a temple of Gaumukha, the Samavasarana, and the Jambudvipa painting. On the outer platform of the main temple, there are idols of Padmavati and Kumarapala himself.

The special times of pilgrimage are during the full moon in the months of Kartika and Chaitra (November and April). In the adjoining shrines are various images. In one shrine is an upright block of marble with 208 representations of the Tirthankara.

Dhankgiri Tirth - Siddhachakra Temple - Patanvav, Gujarat



This Tirth is one of the 108
Tunk (one of the only 5
in existence now) of our
Eternal (Shashvat) Shree
Shatrunjay Tirth. There is
still evidence of ancient
Relics at this location.
Sadhvi Ratna Param Pujya

Charuvratashreeji Maharaj Saheb is the main Inspiration behind this Jirnoddhar. Her spiritual guidance, her continuous Sadhana, and strong ethical morals and virtues have been instrumental in the success of this endeavor.

Another feature that makes it a one of a kind Tirth in the world is the Sthapna of current Chovisi Sidhdhachakra with all the features of Pujniya status e.g. 122 Dev-Devies, 8 Paglas, 9 Pad, 9 Nidhi, 10 Digpal, 9 Grah, 4 Dwarpal, 18 Kalash, 45 Agams, 24 Tirthankars with each of their Yaksh-Yakshini. Mulnayak is Chaumukhi Panchdhatu Pratimaji -Rushabhananji, Chandrananji, Warishenji, Vardhmanji.

27000 sq ft Temple is built with Bansipal stone and construction began in 2001 and was finish in 2006.

It is established in the middle of the beautiful natural scenic mountain location is very captivating and has very nice accommodation amenities and a Bhojansala. It is 70 miles from Rajkot and 15 miles from Giriraj. They have also done performed Pran-Pratishtha of 27 Shantinatji on mountains behind the temple and construction of the 3rd temple out of 27 is going on as of August 2020.

Parshwanth Temple, Lal Mandir - Delhi



The Lal Mandir in. Delhi, the capital of India, is situated at what, at the time of its construction, was a very prestigious, location opposite the Red Fort, at the entrance to the historic Chandni Chowk. built-in

1658 A.D, the year in which the reins of the Mughal Empire passed from Shah Jahan to Aurangzeb, it is said to be the oldest existing temple in Delhi. It is also occasionally referred to as Lashkari Mandir because it was reputedly built by a soldier who was a Jain devotee. Although it has undergone several modifications over time, it remains a haven of peace and tranquility in what has now become a very noisy and chaotic neighborhood. Approximately 50 cm. high, Pratima of Lord Parshwanath, the 23rd Tirthankara, is seated in the lotus posture.

While it is not an ornate as the fine temples in Gujarat and Rajasthan, it does boast detailed carvings and decorative paintwork in the antechambers surrounding the main shrine.

In keeping with the principle of Jeevdaya, the temple premises houses, a unique medical care center for birds, the Bird's Charity Hospital. Free treatment is given here, which draws inspiration from the message of 'Live and let Live' given by Lord Mahavir. The hospital serves as a recuse sanctuary for partridges, caught and wounded by fowlers, and bought in bulk by Jain merchants who bring them here to recover. There are separate wards for pigeons, parrots, sparrows, and domestic fowl. Squirrels, who will not hurt the birds, are also treated here, but birds of prey are seen on a strictly outpatient basis, they are not vegetarians! Most of the cages are home to pigeons with a disease that brings on paralysis. As their condition improves, they are moved to larger cages closer to the roof and eventually released.

The Lal Mandi, together with another temple in Kinari Bazar dedicated to Lord Sumatinath, is sometimes referred to as Shri Indraprastha Tirth. Delhi has about 75 oth-er Jain temples, scattered all over the sprawling city.

Lal Mandir is barely a kilometer from the Delhi Junction railway station.

Dada Adinathji - 108 ft tall statue, Jambud-weep-Palitana, Gujarat



The construction of this enormous 108foot tall statue of Jain Tirthankar, Lord Adinath; stated 2012 and finished in 2015. The numbers here will help you understand the grandness of the statue.

From Ground to Head structure is -120 ft tall, width 30 ft, and 15 ft thick.

Pujya Panyasshree Abhaysagarji Maharaj had a dream to create this enormous statue. It was completed under the supervision of his disciple Ashoksuriji Maharaj. The stones came from the quarry of Porbandar, Una, and Bhadla - 65 km far from Palitana. Each piece was about 30-35 tons, and hand-cut, joined by a copper pipe at the Palitana to create a $120 \times 30 \times 15$ ft structure. About 35 skilled artisans worked on this for about 3 years. Foundation is 20 ft deep. Nine stones, about 50-ton ea, 10xfx5 ft are joined by copper pipes.

Daily Charan pujan can be performed but on Chaitri Punam you can go up the stairs from the back for Mastak Pujan.

Shree Nemi Uday Meru Vihar Dham - Khadol - Gujrat



Shri Nemi Uday Meru Vihardham is located in Khandol, near Ahmedabad. The Mulnayak in this temple is the 20th Tirt-hankar Bhagwan Munisuvtrat Swami. It was built in 2005 with inspiration from

Acharya Sinhsen Sureshverji Maharaj. The temple is built in the shape of a chariot. Behind the Bhagwan's idol, there is a circular Mandal with 84 jewels embedded in it. It is believed the energy of these jewels assists in the devotee's spiritual growth. There is another temple in the same complex with idols of Bhagwan Adinath, Bhagwan Ajitnath, and Bhagwan Shantinath. The goshala has sacred cows such as Kamdhenu and Pitambari. The milk from the Kamdhenu cow is used for the prakshal.

This location is considered sacred because of its history. Several years ago Acharya Shri Nemisurishwarji Maharaj came to this area. There are notable incidents that are considered to have made this area sacred.

Chandraprabhu Temple, Moodabidri, Karnataka



Moodabidri (also called Mudabidri), an ancient center of Jain learning, is a small town about 37 km. northeast of Mangalore, in Karnataka. It is situated at a beautiful spot in the midst of hills. Moodabidri was a

center of Jain religion, culture, art, and architecture during the 14th - 16th centuries. It is famous as the "Jaina Kashi" of the south. Jains from all parts of India come here to worship in the famous 18 Jaina basadis that are dedicated to the memory of the Tirthankaras.

Moodabidri witnessed an unprecedented growth as a center of Jain Religion, culture, art, and architecture during 14th to 16th centuries and more than 18 Jain temples, known as Basadis, were constructed during this period. The most famous among them are Guru basadi, Tribhuvna Tilaka Chudamani Basadi and Ammanavara Basadi.

The Guru basadi is believed to be the earliest of the Jain monuments of this place (714 AD). It is also called Siddhantha Basadi and Hale (Old) Basadi. Lord Parshwana-tha the 23rd Tirthankar of Jainism is the presiding deity of this temple. A

beautiful stone idol of Parshwanatha, about 3.5 meters tall, is installed in the sanctum of this basadi. It is in this basadi that the rare Jain palm leaf manuscripts of 12th century AD known as 'Dhavala texts' were discovered.

The Tribhuvana Tilaka Chudamani basadi is the largest of its kind in Coastal Karnataka and is considered to be the most ornate of the Jain temples of this region. Due to the large number and variety of pillars in this basadi it is known as a thousand pillared temple (Savira Kambada Basadi). The Jain tombs and Nyaya basadi at kodan-gallu, in the outskirts of Moodabidri are monuments of great historical interest.

There are beautiful images of Jain Tirthankar, Yakshas and Yakshis in every Jain basadi of Moodabidri. Moodabidri was a center of Jain literature too. Ratnakara Varni, the doyen of medieval Kannada literature and the author of Bharatesha Vaibhava belonged to this place. The famous Jain canonical texts known as Dhavala texts and also a number of palm leaf manuscripts of immense literacy value are in the possession of the Jain monastery here. During Mughal assaults, the old Jain texts were shift-ed from Shravanabelagola to the safer Moodabidri.

Moodabidri was also the seat of Chowta's a local Jain ruling family, who were originally ruling from Putaige, a village about 5 km from here. This area was ruled by the Jain Chautar dynasty for about 700 years. Moodabidri still maintains its old charm as an important Jain Centre in coastal Karnataka. The city has a large population of Jains who keep the spirit of Jainism still alive. Many jains festivals are also being celebrated here throughout the year.

Moodabidri continues to be the most sought-after pilgrimage center of the Jains from all over the country.

Mahavir Aradhana Kendra Koba, Gujarat



Mahavir Jain Aradhana Kendra is a beautiful Dharma-Tirth and a popular Pilgrimage Center. It is open 365 days and hundreds of thousands of pilgrims visit every year. With the blessings of Acharya

KailasSagarji, Mahavir Aradhana Kendra was envisioned by Acharya PadmaSagarji. It was opened on 26th December 1980. It is situated on Sabarmati-Gandhinagar Highway, about 15 km from Ahmedabad.

The sprawling complex on 20-acre land includes, Mahavir Swami main temple, Gautam Swami Guru Mandir, Gyan Mandir - the largest repository of Indian ancient texts, museum of Jain art & architecture, Upashrays, Dharmashalas, canteen, and Bhojanalay.

The main temple is at a higher plinth, so one has to climb the stairs to enter it. On both sides of the ladder are huge attractive metallic lions, symbol (Lanchhan) of Mahavir Swami. In the Garbha Gruh (Sanctum Sanctorum), the main idol of Bhagwan Mahavir is flanked by the idols of Adinath and Simandhar Swami. The Sabhamandap has the idols of Ajitnath, Vasupujya Swami, Munisuvrat Swami, Neminath, Shantinath, and Parshvanath.

Adjacent to the main temple, the Deri (memorial temple) on the left has Kailash Parshvanath and the Deri on the right has Shankheshvar Parsh-vanath. The underground section houses the huge idol of Bhagwan Rushabhdev, pervading

peace all around. Besides, there are idols of Padmavati Devi and Veer Manibhadra. Also, many ancient and beautiful idols made of Panchdhatu (five metal alloy) are there.

Kailas Sagar Gyan Mandir is a unique Jain and Indological academic research and reference center. It is fully computerized and houses the largest library of its kind.

There is a miracle associated with this magnificent pink Mahavialaya with 3 beautiful domes. Every year, on 22nd May, exactly at 2:07 pm, the sun rays penetrate from the Shikhar to the forehead of Bhagwan Mahavir Swami and brighten it as Tilak. It is noted in the Guinness Book of World Re-cords and Golden Book of World Records.

Shrut Tirth - Patan - Gujarat



The Grand Divine Pravachan Shrut Tirth is built about 3 kilometers from the Shankheshvar Mahatirth in the Patan district of Gujarat. The concept of the Shrut Mandir is unique It provides an excellent

facility to stay. The entire complex of eleven acres houses Chaturmukh Jinalay, Shrut Mandir with Shrutdevi Maa Sarada Pratima, Aradhana Bhavan for monks, and Sadhviji, Dharamshala, Bojanshala, Manibhadraveer Devakulika, Shrut Darshan Bhavan, beautiful garden, and medicine forest.

Chaturmukh Jinalay is 72 feet high with 51 inches white milk stone idols of Shri Shankheshvar Parshvnath, Shri Shantinath, Shri Adinath, and Shri Neminath lords. To the right side, Shri Ramchandra Aacharya Guru-mandir, and the left side, Manibhadraveer Devakulika mandir enhances the grandeur of the main Jinalay. In the basement, the metal idol of Mul-Nayak Shri Mahavir Bhagavan is installed with Pratima of Gautam Swami and Gurumurti Shriman Devsuriji in the front.

The heart of Pravachan Shrut Tirth is "Shrut Mandir' in an area of 100 thousand square feet. A grand statue of Shrutdevi Maa Sarada, the height of 108 inches, is installed in the center. In front of the statue, there is a place for worship so that the devotees will be awakened in good faith.

Currently, more than 50 thousand scriptures are available on hand-textured paper with chemical-free ink. It is expected to last 1000 years. University caliber facility is also provided for PhD research, advanced spiritual studies. The library has over 300 thousand books available for research and study. The art gallery depicts the entire history, starting from Mahavira till date, which outlines shrut origin, shrut collection process, shrut patron-age, shrut writing and shrut enrichment. The entire complex came into existence with the inspiration and blessing of Acharya Vijay Purnachandra Suriji and Acharya Vijay Yugchandra Suriji.

Mangalayatan Teerthdham, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh



The famous Jain place of pilgrimage of 21st Century, Mangalayatan Teerthdham was established on July 17th July 2000 by Shri Adinath KundKund Digambar Jain Trust. The premise of Mangalayatan

Teerthdham encompasses beautiful monuments and

temples. Visiting this place is a threat to one's eyes, heart & soul.

The entry in this majestic world of Mangalayatan Teerthdham is through the majestic Singhdwar which is considered as the official starting point of the temple grounds. Singhdwar is based on 16 pillars carved from pink stone. Each Pillar is 21 feet high and 34 feet wide.

At a distance of 68 feet from the Singhdwar, stands the huge Pillar of Dignity (Maanstambh) made of solid white marble. All the three platforms of the Maanstambh are adorned with Uphadyay's, Munirajas, and stories depicting various aspects of Jainism (Jain Darshan Gaathas). The top platform has four 27 inches high idols of Lord Adinath facing ain all the four directions. The bottom platform also has 23 inches idols of Lord Adinath arranged in a similar fashion. Each idol shows the Lord seated on a lotus throne.

The Salvation Land (Nirvanbhoomi) of the first Teerthanka rLord Adinath is epitomized at a distance of 117 feet from the Maanstambh. This place has been developed as Kailash Parvat. It is 40 feet high. Another way to reach Kailash Parvat is through a ramp. This ramp way has lifelike sculptures on the right-hand side. These sculptures depict the various phases of Lord Adinathswami's life like Conception (Garbhakalayanak), Birth (Janmakalyanak), Royal Installation, (Rajyabhishek),Non-attachment to world pleasures (Vairagya), Renunciation (Dikshakalyank) & Completion of first fasting (Pratham Parana).

On the left-hand side of the Kailash Parvat stands the beautiful Temple of Shasannyak Lord Mahavir. in the temple, lies a marvelous Altar (Vedi) of white marble, at the center of which 33 inches high idol of Lord Mahavir is seated. On either side of this idol are 30 inches high idols of Lord Parshwanath & Lord Shantinath sitting posture.

On the right-hand side of the Kailash Parvat, there also is Lord Bahubali Temple which is a design replica of the Lord Mahavir Temple. The idol is 87 inches high and is shown in Khadaqasan posture on a lotus throne.

Choghadiya Muhurat is more popular in North India and used as ready reckoner to find a good Muhurat without consulting a learned scholar in astrology. In South India a similar concept of Gowri Panchangam exists which is very much similar to Choghadiya Muhurat.

About Choghadiya Table

Shubh

Choghadiya or Chogadia is used for checking auspicious time to start new work. Traditionally Choghadiya is used for travel muhurthas but due to its simplicity it is used for any muhurtha. There are four good Choghadiya, Amrit, Shubh, Labh and Chal-to start auspicious work.

Three bad Choghadiya, Rog, Kaal and Udveg-should be avoided. The time between sunrise and sunset is called day Choghadiya and the time between sunset and next day sunrise is called night Choghadiya. About Vaar Vela, Kaal Vela and Kaal Ratri It is believed that no auspicious work should be done during Vaar Vela, Kaal Vela and Kaal Ratri. Vaar Vela and Kaal Vela prevail during day time while Kaal Ratri prevails during night time. It is believed that all Manglik works done during these timings are not fruitful
