






#### **Charukeerthy Bhattarak Swamiji**

Claire Maes, PhD a native of Belgium, is a scholar of South Asian religions and languages. She is a Junior Professor at the Department of Indology at the University of Tübingen in Germany. Prior to this, Dr. Maes was a post-doctoral fellow at the University of Texas at Austin where she taught Jainism, Buddhism, and Sanskrit, among other South Asian topics. She researches and teaches on Jainism, Death and Dying, Indian Philosophy and the Practice of Non-Violence, among other topics. She is currently working on a monograph that investigates the Jain practice of fasting.







**Shivani Bothra,** PhD is Bhagwaan Mahavir/Chao Family Foundation Postdoctoral Fellow in Jain Studies at Rice University. She explores migration of Jain communities within India and the United States. Her research focuses largely on the religious education within the context of keeping the tradition alive outside the homeland. The main themes of her research have been migration, religious education, curricula, and gender roles. John Cort, PhD Denison University, Ohio John E. Cort is Professor Emeritus of Asian and Comparative Religions at Denison University in Granville, Ohio, where he also taught in the East Asian Studies, Environmental Studies and International Studies programs. He is the author of Jains in the World: Religious Values and Ideology in India (2001) and Framing the Jina: Narratives of Icons and Idols in Jain History (2010), as well as several dozen articles on the Jains, and on the culture, history and literature of western India. He is co-editor with Andrea Luithle-Hardenberg and Leslie C. Orr of Cooperation, Contribution and Contestation: The Jain Community, Colonialism and Jainological Scholarship (2020); and with Paul Dundas, Knut Jacobsen and Kristi L. Wiley of Brill's Encyclopedia of Jainism (2020).







Nalini Balbir, PhD teaches Indology at Sorbonne-Nouvelle University and Middle Indian philology at the Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes, Paris. The Jain tradition in its diversity (narrative literature, canonical texts but also aspects of contemporary Jain practice) is her main area of research. During the last years her focus has been on Jain manuscript collections. This has implied cataloguing but also investigating colophons and paintings and, more broadly, the ways texts and visuals interact. **Olle Qvarnström,** PhD is a professor of History of Religions at Lund University, Sweden. His research has primarily been devoted to medieval philosophical and theological traditions of Brahmanism, Buddhism and Jainism, whose ideological systems, conflicts, and mutual influences have been studied from previously unworked source material in Sanskrit, Prakrit and Tibetan; even Indian art and Jain relations to Islam has been part of his research.








Peter Flugel, PhD is a Founding Chair Center of Jaina Studies and Professor of the Study of Religions and Philosophies at the Department of History, Religions and Philosophies in the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London. He has published extensively on the history, anthropology and sociology of contemporary Jain schools and sects, Jain relic stūpas, Jaina-Vaiṣṇava syncretism, and on the socio-political and legal history of the Jain tradition. He is also working on social theory, and questions of comparative philosophy, pluralism and non-violence. He convenes the Annual Jaina Studies Workshops at SOAS, is editor of the International Journal of Jain Studies, series editor of Routledge Advances in Jaina Studies, and Jaina Studies of Harrassowitz, and principal investigator of the Jaina-Prosopography project.








Christopher Key Chapple, PhD is Doshi Professor of Indic and Comparative Theology and founding Director of the Master of Arts in Yoga Studies at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles. A specialist in the religions of India, he has published more than twenty books, including the recent Living Landscapes: Meditations on the Elements in Hindu, Buddhist, and Jain Yogas (SUNY Press) and, co-edited with Shugan Jain, Sallekhana (DK). He serves as advisor to multiple organizations including the Forum on Religion and Ecology (Yale), the Ahimsa Center (Pomona), the Dharma Academy of North America (Berkeley), the Jain Studies Centre (SOAS, London), the South Asian Studies Association, and International School for Jain Studies (New Delhi).







Robert P. Goldman, PhD is Professor Emeritus and Professor in the Graduate School of Sanskrit at the University of California, Berkeley, where for many decades he was a colleague of Professor Jaini. He is editor and co-translator of the seven-volume translation of the Rāmāyaṇa of Vālmīki, and author of many books and articles on India and Sanskrit, including the widely used introductory textbook Devavāṇīpraveśikā: An Introduction to the Sanskrit Language.
