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**COURT REMAINS OPEN, TAKES PRECAUTIONS:
CANCELLATION OF ALL JURY TRIALS THROUGH MAY 1, 2020**

Today, Chief Judge Thomas Kelly Ryan addressed precautions taken for COVID-19 by issuing Administrative Order 20-02.

As it performs essential functions, the 10th Judicial District Court in Johnson County REMAINS OPEN. The risk level in our district is escalating with four confirmed cases. Health care professionals advise that we should all minimize contact to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 coronavirus. The District Court intends to take the following reasonable measures toward that end:

- Juries: The Court system cannot function without juries. All jury trials scheduled through May 1, 2020, are CONTINUED pending further Order of the Court. Any juror that received a summons for trials from March 16 through May 1, 2020 do not need to report to the courthouse on the assigned date on your summons. All jurors summoned during this time will be placed back into the jury pool and may be summoned later in the year.
- Litigants: If you have a case scheduled and begin to feel ill, you should consider the following:
 - Contact the opposing party or attorney to explore an agreed continuance.
 - If there is no agreement, contact the administrative assistant for the division presiding over your case to advise if you are unable to attend court. Judges will consider on a case-by-case basis whether a continuance of the court date is in order.
- Marriages: We will not schedule any new marriage ceremonies. However, we request you reach out to the division planning to perform your ceremony prior to arriving at the courthouse.
- The Help Center will be closed to in-person consultations. Assistance is still available online and by telephone.

The current situation is one that presents challenges to the Court's normal operating procedures. We are looking at all of the ways in which we might temporarily alter those procedures to minimize risk while still attending to the Court's core responsibilities. We appreciate the cooperation and patience of the public as we work to implement these changes in procedure.

Administrative Order No. 20-02

ORDER REGARDING COURT OPERATIONS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

This Order is being issued in response to the recent outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Johnson County Kansas. As of the date of this Order, there are four confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Johnson County and one confirmed death in Kansas. Although for many this disease appears to cause only flu-like symptoms, for others it can pose a serious risk.

In February of this year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") issued "Interim Guidance" recommending that all employers consider how best to decrease the spread of COVID-19¹. On March 11, 2020, The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic². On March 12, 2020, Kansas Governor Laura Kelly declared a state of emergency to address this developing threat.

Given the significant number of identified and projected cases of COVID-19 and the severity of risk posed to the public, and given the recommendations from local public health authorities, it is hereby ORDERED that, effective Friday, March 13, 2020:

1. The Kansas 10th Judicial District courthouse remains open. Staff in the Clerk's Office will remain open for filings, including contact by telephone.
2. The Help Center is open via telephone and e-mail. In-person consultations are not available until further notice.
3. Electronic filings may still be made through the JIMS system. The public is encouraged to continue utilizing available court resources.
4. All jury trials (civil and criminal) scheduled through May 1, 2020, are CONTINUED pending further Order of the Court.
5. All non-jury court proceedings scheduled for an in-court appearance through May 1, 2020 may be CONTINUED by the presiding judge. Case-by-case exceptions for continuances provided herein may be ordered for non-jury matters at the discretion of the Court after consultation with counsel.
6. All non-essential Chapter 61 Limited Actions hearings scheduled through May 1, 2020 shall be CONTINUED pending further Order of the Court. Plaintiff's attorneys are required to obtain a new hearing date and properly notify defendant(s). 7. In criminal cases, the Court has a reduced ability to obtain an adequate spectrum of jurors. COVID-19 dictates consideration of the health and welfare of our citizen jurors. The availability of counsel and Court staff is also impacted. Therefore, the time period of


the continuances implemented by this Order is tolled. The Court specifically finds that this public health concern demands that the Court take all precautions to protect the health of the public and judicial branch employees alike.

8. The Court will continue to hear matters at the courthouse as determined by the individual judge. This Order does not affect the Court's consideration of any matters that can be resolved without oral argument or court appearance.

The Court will take a phased response based on our evaluation of developing data and public health recommendations about the current pandemic.
