Dr. Wright is well known for her study of the diagnosis and treatment of arrhythmias in companion animals. She was the first veterinarian in the country to adapt radiofrequency catheter ablation to dogs. She is a prolific author of veterinary subjects for textbooks and veterinary publications. She has particular interest arrhythmias, cardiac electrophysiology, and radiofrequency catheter ablation.

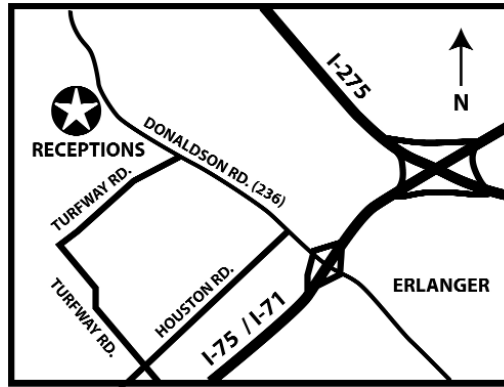
