

## OUTDOOR FAMILY VISITATION IN INDEPENDENT LIVING

The entire Glenaire campus has been closed to visitors since March to comply with the governor's COVID guidance and protect residents from the virus. We realize that the social isolation has been very difficult for residents and families. Now that the state has entered Phase 2.5 of the COVID response plan we would like to take a first step towards opening things up in a progressive, thoughtful manner. We will begin allowing outdoor visitation in *Independent Living* starting Wednesday, September 16. You will find information about these visits below.

- Family visitation hours will be seven days per week, 9 am to 6 pm.
- All visitors must come first to the screening area at the main entrance. They will need to complete a screening questionnaire and have a temperature check. Once they pass the screening, they will receive a wristband that they should wear while on campus.
- You may have three visitors at a time. Children who attend the visit must be able to wear a mask the entire visit.
- Both the resident and the visitors must wear masks at all times. There should not be any eating since this would require the removal of masks.
- You should practice social distancing with your guests, remaining six feet apart and resisting the urge to hug or touch.

- All visits must occur **OUTSIDE**. We recommend the following areas, which have been set up with chairs for visitation:

-The area on the concrete parking pad for golf carts just outside the Stone Board Room. Residents can access this area via a door on the hallway just past the marketing suite. Families can park in the overflow parking spots between the 1000 and 2000 buildings and take the outside walkway to the parking pad.

-The courtyard behind the 3000 building. Once your family has signed in at the main entrance, they can step outside and take the sidewalk on the right to the end, then take another right to get to the courtyard.

-Beside the pond on Wee Loch, in the area where the bocce ball court used to be. If you take the first right onto the Wee Loch loop and look to your left about halfway up you should see the seating area.

-The area past the 2000 building and just past the outside walkway to the pool. There is a small parking area available there, and benches in the shade.

You can also visit outside in areas where you will not be near other residents. For example, cottage residents could visit family in their driveways.

- Please DO NOT visit in any area that would require other residents to walk past you. This includes the area under the overhangs just outside the entrances of the main building or the apartment buildings. Also do not visit on the patio behind the Auditorium. This area is reserved for resident use.
- This policy is subject to change at any time as the COVID situation changes on our campus and in our community.
