# QUALITY APEX: IDENTIFYING NUMBERS

## BACKGROUND

To use Quality Apex, the SNF's FAC\_ID will need to be looked up from an MDS 3.0 file from the SNF. An MDS 3.0 file is a zip file that contains one or more XML files. Each XML is an assessment while the MDS 3.0 file is a batch of XML assessment files. FAC\_ID is one of the fields that is required in each assessment files. It is this field along with the field STATE\_CD (i.e., 3 letter state abbreviation) that uniquely identifies the SNF from other SNFs. While there are many identifying numbers from CMS and the state health department that a SNF may have to identify themselves, the FAC\_ID from their MDS 3.0 files is what is required to properly setup their account in Quality Apex.

Another identifying number that is needed to setup Quality Apex is the Federal Provider Number. This number is not the same as the National Provider number. This number is the Identifying number for each SNF on Nursing Home Compare.

## STEPS TO RETRIEVE SNF'S FAC\_ID

Someone in the SNF who has access to the SNF's MDS 3.0 files (e.g., MDS coordinator, etc.) will need to complete the following steps:

1. Unzip MDS 3.0 file.
  - a. In newer versions of Windows, right click on the file and select "Extract".
  - b. There are other applications that can be also be used to unzip files such as Winzip.
2. Open one of the files that was part of the zip file using a text editor such as Notepad on a Windows machine.
3. Look for a line in the file that looks like the following: <FAC\_ID>**A123456**</FAC\_ID>
4. The characters between the opening tag (<FAC\_ID>) and the closing tag (</FAC\_ID>) are the SNF's FAC\_ID. In the example above the FAC\_ID is A123456. The FAC\_ID can have length of 16 characters but will most likely be much shorter.

## STEPS TO RETRIEVE SNF'S FEDERAL PROVIDER NUMBER

Anyone in the SNF can complete the following steps:

1. Find the SNF on Nursing Home Compare (<https://www.medicare.gov/nursinghomecompare/search.html?>).
2. Click on the name of the SNF in the search results.
3. In the URL of your web browser window you will see something like the following:  
/profile.html#profTab=0&ID=**597E15**&Distn=0.0
4. The characters between "&ID=" and the next "&" are the SNF' Federal Provider Number. In the example above the SNF' Federal Provider Number is 597E15.

## WHAT TO DO WITH THESE IDENTIFYING NUMBERS?

Once the FAC\_ID and Federal Provider Numbers have been identified, these numbers are required to be included in Exhibit C of the Quality Apex agreement (page 9).
