### OVERVIEW:

Did you know the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has a requirement that the first time an opioid is given by a nurse, a special assessment must be completed? Does your hospital have a safe opioid policy that specifies what vital signs must be taken, how often your staff takes the vital signs, and if your staff is going to use pulse oximetry and/or ETCO<sub>2</sub>? This webinar will cover the revised standards on the CMS hospital conditions of participation (CoPs) on safe opioid use, IV medication and blood transfusion. This section has been amended five times in the past few years, along with an amendment added last year to nursing section 405 that addresses safe injection practices, compounding and beyond use date. This informative webinar will also cover Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) opioid guidelines; Joint Commission final pain management guidelines; federal guidelines for opioid programs; opioid epidemic and required hospital policies and training. In addition, the CMS standards on the care of the patient receiving opioids apply to critical access hospitals.

### OBJECTIVES:

- Discuss that CMS has issued a 32-page memo on medication administration and safe opioid use;
- Describe that all medications must be administered within three different time frames;
- Recall that CMS has required policies and education requirements on medication administration and safe opioid use;
- Discuss that CMS has requirements to ensure nurses are competent when giving IV medications or blood transfusions; and
- Recall that the CDC issued opioid prescribing guidelines.
