



Using Zoom with YouTube to Live Stream Meetings

BEFORE you want to use Zoom for meetings, make sure you have allowed 24-48 hours (at a minimum) to allow YouTube to enable live streaming on your channel. Here's how you do this:

Log into your channel through YouTube or go to www.lkm.org/account. In the upper right corner, go to settings (click the little gear icon).



Before you can live stream through YouTube, your account needs to be verified and not have any violations. You can see this on this screen below. If you do not have the blue verified button, go through steps to verify and do the same if there are any violations.



If you are verified and no violations, click on “enable” under the Live Streaming Feature.
