We're ready to help you find your balance, learn how to better work with your constituents, and move your city further with good governance and visionary leadership. Check out the *latest schedule on-line!*




## LEAGUE GOVERNING BODY NOMINATIONS DUE SEPTEMBER 13

Do you know of an elected city official who has demonstrated outstanding service to their community, is actively committed to strong local government and participates with the League of Kansas Municipalities? Consider nominating the elected official for the E.A. Mosher Excellence in Local Government Award. Nominees for the E.A. Mosher Excellence in Local Government Award must meet the following qualifications:



- Must be an elected official from a League member city;
- Must have held elective office for a minimum of four years;
- Must demonstrate contributions that have had a significant impact on the quality of life of the citizens of his or her city;
- Must demonstrate contributions in promoting positive intergovernmental relationships; and
- Must show involvement with the League.
