#### US DEPT OF TRANSPORTATION - RAISE GRANT

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) appropriated \$1.5 billion to be awarded by the U.S. Department of Transportation for National Infrastructure Investment grants under the "Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Transportation Discretionary Grants program." This is the first year of the RAISE Transportation Discretionary Grants program under the BIL. The grant program funds will be awarded on a competitive basis for surface transportation infrastructure projects that will have a significant Local or Regional impact. The attached FY 2022 RAISE Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) and related information, including initial FAOs, is now available on the *RAISE website*.

The application deadline is April 14, 2022 at 5 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time (EDT). To provide technical assistance to stakeholders, the U.S. DOT will host a series of webinars during the FY 2022 RAISE grant application period. KDOT has opened their call for concepts for planning and construction projects to make walking and cycling safe, accessible, enjoyable, and an accepted and encouraged form of transportation in our Kansas communities.
