

**Michigan Association of
Osteopathic Family Physicians, Inc.**

Articles of Incorporation

Article I

The name or title by which said corporation is to be known in law is The Michigan Association of Osteopathic Family Physicians, Inc., (MAOFP) a non-profit corporation.

Article II

The purposes for which it is formed are as follows:

- A To advance the standards of family practice in the field of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery in the State of Michigan.
- B. To encourage and improve the educational opportunities for the training of family physicians in all branches of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery in the State of Michigan.
- C. To promote and maintain the highest moral and ethical standards in the practice of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery in the State of Michigan.
- D. To establish an affiliate society of the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOF) which shall be composed of duly qualified, licensed, osteopathic physicians and medical professionals who engage in family practice of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery.

- E. To abide by the code of ethics of the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) and the ACOFP which shall be the code of ethics of this society.
- F. To do all other things permitted non-profit organizations by the laws of the State of Michigan.
- G. In general to carry on any activity in connection therewith and incident thereto, and not forbidden to non-profit corporations, by the laws of the State of Michigan and with all powers conferred upon non-profit corporations by the laws of the State of Michigan.
- H. To foster the student and physician in training participation in this and other osteopathic medical organizations and to support the development of student leaders in our profession.

Article III – Location

Article IV

Article VI

Except as otherwise provided by law, a volunteer trustee or volunteer officer of the Corporation

is not personally liable to the Corporation or its members for monetary damages for a breach of the trustee's or officer's fiduciary duty. The corporation assumes the liability for all acts or omissions of a volunteer trustee or volunteer officer, provided that:

- A. the volunteer was acting or reasonably believed he or she was acting within the scope of his or her authority;
- B. the volunteer was acting in good faith;
- C. the volunteer's conduct did not amount to gross negligence or willful and wanton misconduct;
- D. the volunteer's conduct was not an intentional tort; and
- E. the volunteer's conduct was not a tort arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of a motor vehicle as described in Section 209(e)(v) of the Act.
