Executive Committee

Nominating Committee: Select the best-qualified representatives from the full, active membership to serve as candidates for the Board of Governors.

Awards Committee: Select and administer all MARRCH awards, review the existing awards program to determine the need for modifications, eliminations, suspensions, or additions of awards.

Ethics Committee: The Ethics Committee is dedicated to promoting education, offering support, and advocating for the ethical practice of chemical health counseling.

Training & Education Committee: To develop the content and content positioning of MARRCH's Annual Conference, Spring Conference, and additional member related events as directed by the Board of Governors.

Public Policy Committee: Communicate and coordinate public policy and advocacy initiatives from MARRCH's strategic plan and all working groups and collaborate with others as needed.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Workgroup: Provide Black, Brown, or Indigenous organizations support and resources to navigate systems in MN to reduce barriers and support communities that are underserved.

Policy Implementation Workgroup: Our SUD providers review, discuss, and prepare for upcoming legislative changes.

Rural Health Disparities Workgroup: Their mission is to identify and document disparities in services in rural areas, determine barriers that cause them, and recommend changes to overcome them.

Withdrawal Management and Detox Workgroup: Monthly meeting with detox and Withdrawal Management providers and DHS to discuss program standards, policy, and billing.

Direct Access Workgroup: Work with Department of Corrections (DOC), Minnesota Sheriffs Association (MSA), Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), Department of Human Services (DHS) and MARRCH providers toward direct access for all Minnesotans, regardless of where they reside.

SUD Responsivity Workgroup: Includes the MN Department of Corrections to improve collaboration and client services between SUD providers, corrections, and people with justice involvement.

Legislative & Policy Workgroup: To develop and propose legislative ideas and language to improve client services and SUD Policy. Review and collaborate with other stakeholders regarding legislative proposals.

Systems Improvement and Paperwork Prevention Workgroup: Blend the state's and providers needs to reduce paperwork burden, create uniform standards, and make data collection efforts efficient to ultimately improve client services. Includes a number of action teams (DAANES/Billing, Licensing, Documentation, and 1115).
