

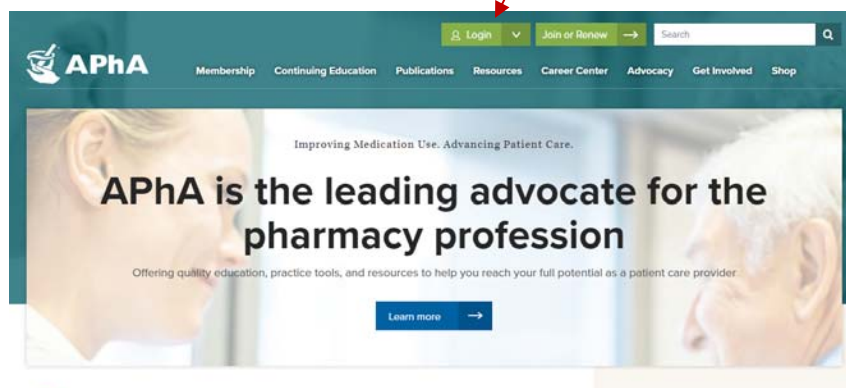
Increasing Access to Hormonal Contraceptive Products Participant Instructions

Many states are allowing pharmacists to prescribe hormonal contraceptives to increase and ensure access. APhA's Increasing Access to Hormonal Contraceptive Products training program is a 4-hour online interactive program that will prepare pharmacists to discuss the hormonal contraceptive options available to prescribe, furnish or dispense, in accordance with state laws. The program contains four modules, each with an associated assessment. You must successfully pass each module's assessment to complete the program.

Let's Get Started!

Step 1:

Log into www.pharmacist.com.



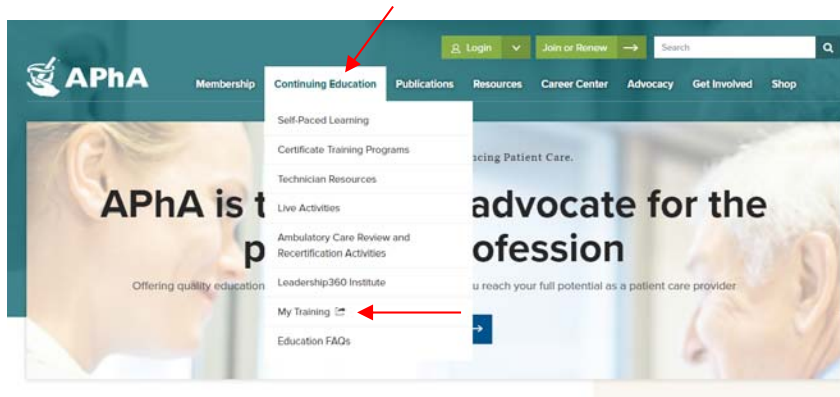
If you are a New User, click **create an account**. If you have previously completed any APhA training program or any CPE through APhA's periodicals, Annual Meetings, or webinars, you already have an account on www.pharmacist.com. If you have an account but do not know your username and/or password, after clicking **Login**, click **Forgot Username** or **Forgot Password**. If you do not receive an email within a few moments, this most likely signifies that you have more than one account OR your current email address is not in our system.

Please Note: Usernames are email addresses. Also, it is important that you have only one APhA account, as this will be the account associated with your NABP number and all other APhA Education Activities.

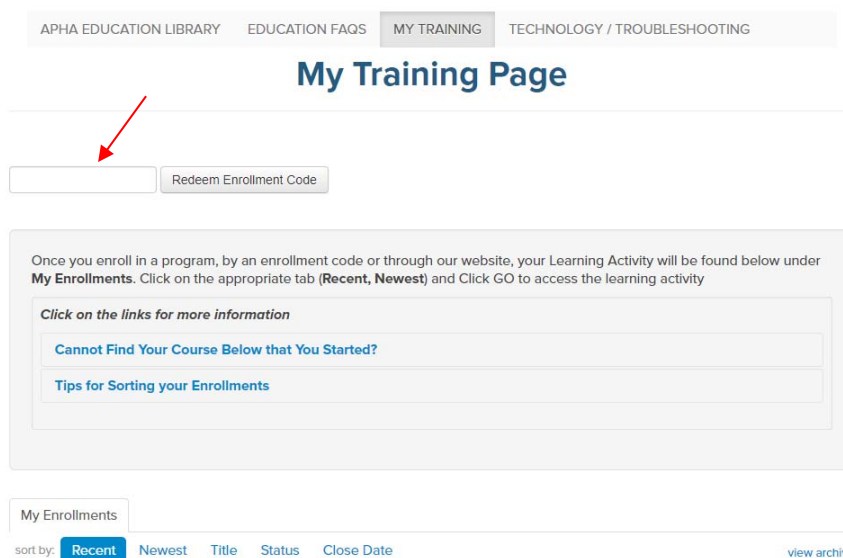
Step 2:

Click on Continuing Education/My Training.



Step 3:

Enter the enrollment code given to you by your program coordinator in the box on the left side of the screen on the "My Training Page" and click "Redeem Enrollment Code". The code is not case sensitive. Once the code has been accepted, the activity will appear in your My Enrollments tab.



Please note that your organization's management and APhA education staff have access to all participants who redeem an enrollment code. **This code is not to be shared***.

Step 4:

Click on the name of the program to open it. Once the activity is open, you will see the name of the program (Increasing Access to Hormonal Contraceptive Products) and eight sections to complete. The sections are:

- Welcome
- Research Study (Pre-Program)
- Module 1: Hormonal Contraceptive Products
- Module 2: Assessing Women for Hormonal Contraception
- Module 3: Communicating About Hormonal Contraceptives
- Module 4: Pharmacy Practice Operations
- Research Study (Post-Program)
- Certificate of Completion

APhA, in partnership with Midwestern University, is conducting a research study on program participants' knowledge and perception of pharmacist contraceptive prescribing. In the two sections titled "Research Study", your participation in the study is voluntary but will be extremely valuable in evaluating the program's impact.

Increasing Access to Hormonal Contraceptive Products has been approved for 4 hours of CPE credit. To earn CPE credit for this program you must successfully complete each module's assessment with a passing score of 70% or better and complete the module's evaluation. You will claim 1 hour of CPE credit for each module successfully completed. After you have completed all program requirements you will be eligible to receive your Certificate of Completion. The Certificate of Completion, which is a printable document, will be available to you for immediate printing.
