What is a Nurse Anesthetist ?

- A nurse anesthetist is a registered nurse (RN) who has specialized training and gives anesthesia to patients having surgery, medical procedures or who are injured.

What does a CRNA do?



Provide different types of anesthesia that help patients sleep, feel no pain, remain still, and not have bad memories of their surgery.

What does a CRNA do?



Monitors patients' vital signs, such as blood pressure, heart rate, and breathing.

What does a CRNA do?



Stays with patients throughout
their entire surgery!

What does a CRNA do?



Wakes up patients after surgery and brings them to the recovery room
