Report of the Secretary/Treasurer: Chief Tim Jungel

Secretary/Treasurer Chief Tim Jungel provided the Board with an update of the current MACP financials. The bank and investment accounts of the Association total \$2,051,098. The 2025 profit loss through October 2, 2025, reflects a net income of \$39,979.85. The Association remains in good financial standing.

Chief Ergang offered a motion to *Approve the MACP Financials as Presented*; the motion was supported by Chief Woods and passed by unanimous consent.

Report of the Executive Director: Ret. Chief Ron Wiles

MCOLES Separation Record/Separation Affidavit Presentation

MCOLES Executive Director Bourgeois provided a PowerPoint presentation on Separation Affidavits and Separation Records highlighting the requirements for agencies in accordance with PA 203 of 1965 (MCOLES Act) and PA 128 of 2017 (LEO Separation of Service Act) and the difference between the two Acts.

Executive Director Bourgeois also noted that if agencies do not comply, legislation may be enacted and that penalties may be added. He added that MCOLES has no control over the Separation Record. The officer has no control over the affidavit but does have control over the record. He added that the Commission does have subpoena power, though it is rarely used and typically only in egregious cases.

Report of the Accreditation Program Director: Matt Silverthorn

Accreditation Update

An Accreditation Manager Training (AMT) was held yesterday at Zeeland Police Department which was well attended. The next AMT is scheduled at Plymouth PD on November 6th. There are currently 20 Attendees registered.

There are currently 96 accredited agencies, and we are expecting five new agencies to be accredited at the Winter Conference. November and December will be very busy with assessments for new and re-accrediting agencies.

Reports of the Special Committees

Legislative Committee Report

Chairman Kirk presented the bills that were discussed at this morning's Legislative Committee Meeting.

President O'Donohue expressed his sincere appreciation to the Legislative Committee for their diligent work on behalf of the MACP.

MCOLES Report – Exec. Director Tim Bourgeois

Executive Director Bourgeois provided updates on the impact of the new budget on MCOLES.

A total of \$10 million was approved for Public Safety Assistance Funding, along with \$50 million allocated to the Public Safety Trust Fund. The \$50 million will be dedicated specifically to public safety and will be distributed by the Treasury Department. At this time, no determination has been made regarding the distribution process.

MCOLES is still working on funds for January academies. He also noted that there have been cuts to CPE money and they ended up with \$13 million.

SACOP Report – Chief Matt Bade

Chief Bade reported that there has been discussion at SACOP regarding license plate readers. He noted that Illinois has attempted to block police from access to the data.
