October, 2012 MDCH awarded a three-year grant to address two of the nation's top substance abuse prevention priorities

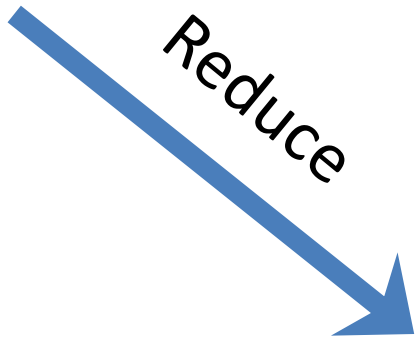
1) Underage drinking among persons aged 12 to 20

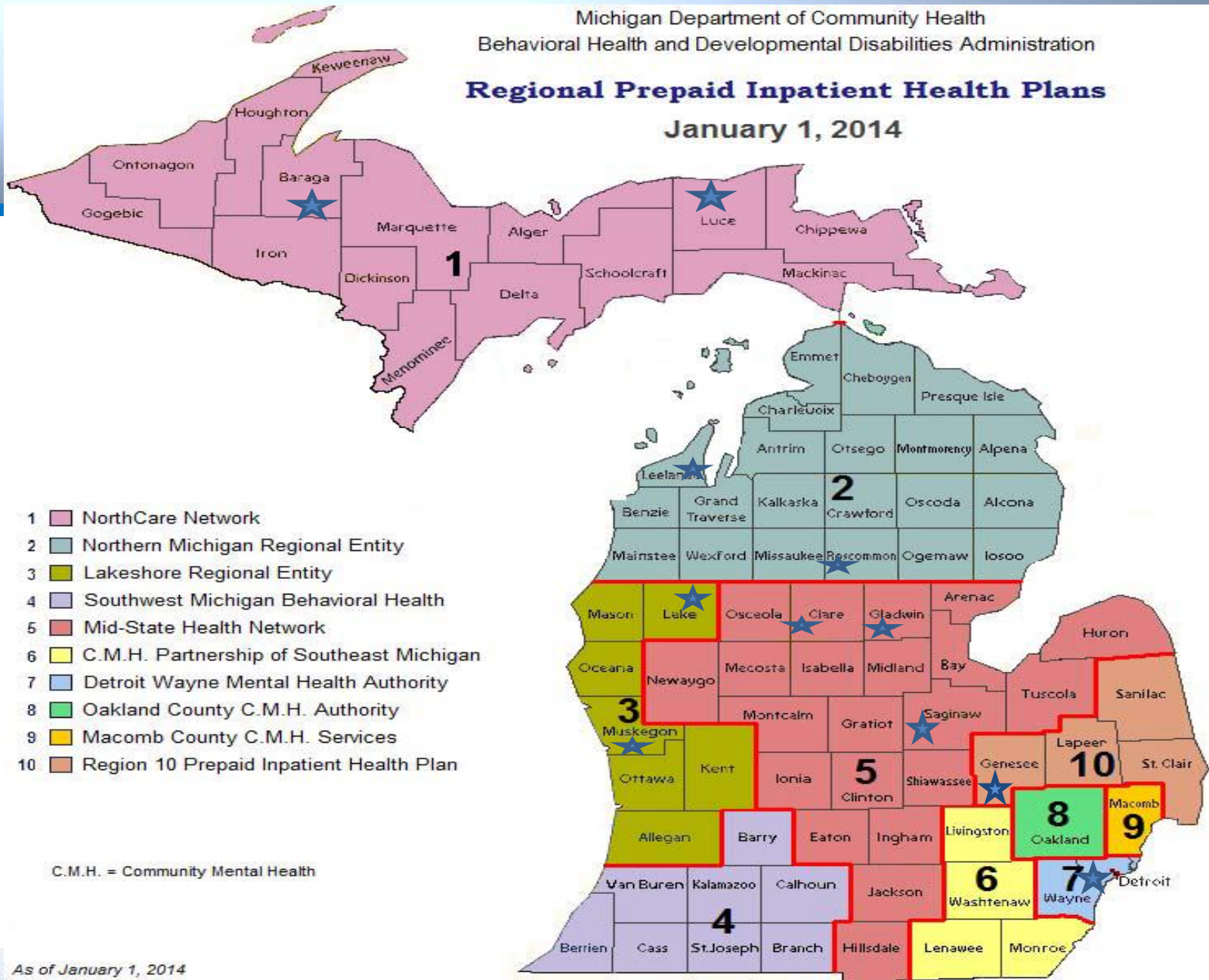

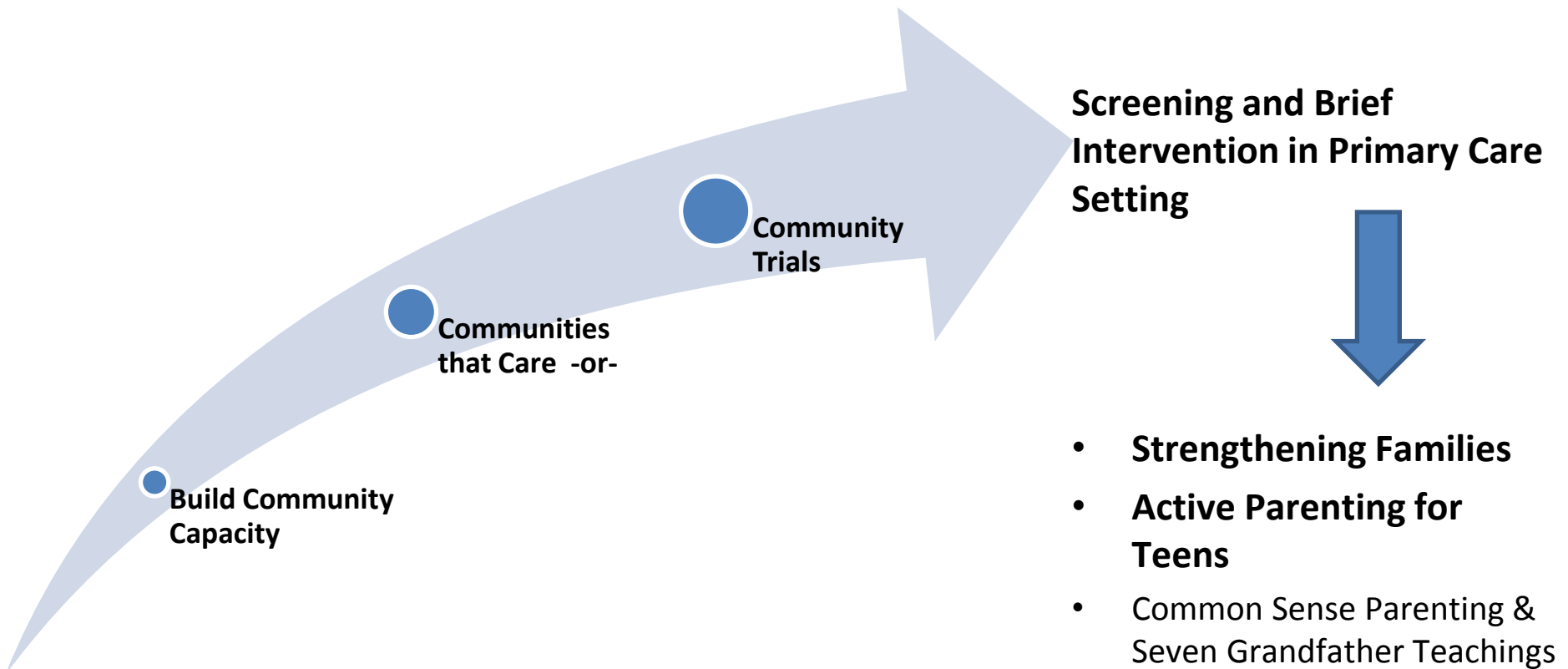

Community Coalition

- Comprised of **parents, youth, teachers, law enforcement, businesses, religious leaders, media & health providers** are mobilized at the local level
- Promotes coordination & collaboration to make efficient use of limited resources to achieve **REAL** outcomes
- Components of effective coalition include **clear organizational structure, membership capacity, and sustainability**

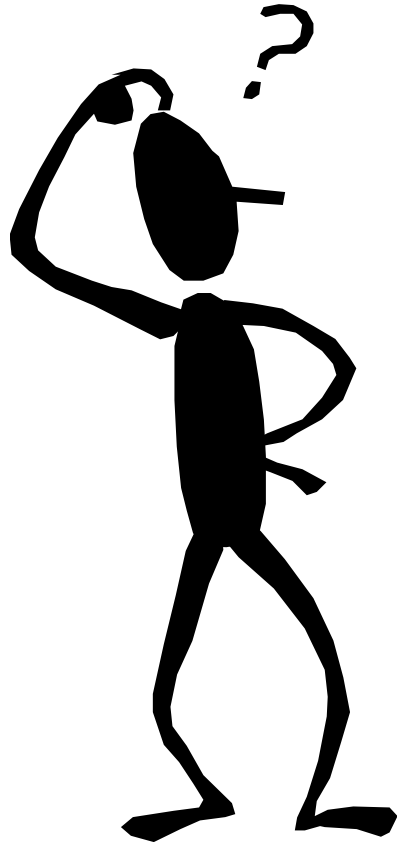
