HEALTH DELIVERY IN THE DIGITAL SPACE

Dr Kylie Henderson FIEP The Better Health Generation

There is no disputing that mental health is rising as a result of COVID. How will we become part of the solution, on such a bigger scale?



The international academic research evidence shows that digital health tools have a larger impact when combined with one-on-one services. However, only 2% of digital health tools have evidence that they are safe, and can effectively assist those with mental health conditions. This presentation will look at digital services from a health perspective, knowing that if we can combine digital mental health tools with employability, we can have a larger impact on employment outcomes. This presentation will also include a demonstration of an innovative solution that solves mental health, employability and health issues - YourHealth+Work.

Dr Kylie Henderson is a fellow of the Australisian
Institute of Digital Health, a clinical psychologist and
Founder and Managing Director of The Better Health
Generation Australia & UK. The Better Health Generation (TBHG)
is an organisation of thought-leading health professionals bound
together by their commitment to quality and care.

Dr Henderson has more than 20 years of experience in mental health and work. She has published in academic journals on the effectiveness of health services within the employment services sector. Dr Henderson has spent the last five years in a health innovation role developing a digital health solution with technology experts that increases the engagement of job seekers in services, builds the skills of work coaches, and increases the speed of job seekers returning to work.

Dr Henderson holds a Doctorate of Clinical Psychology, is an adjuct research fellow of the University of Southern Queensland, Secretary of the Australian Psychological Society Clinical College, a Fellow of the Institute of Employability Professionals (UK), a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts (UK) and a graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors.
